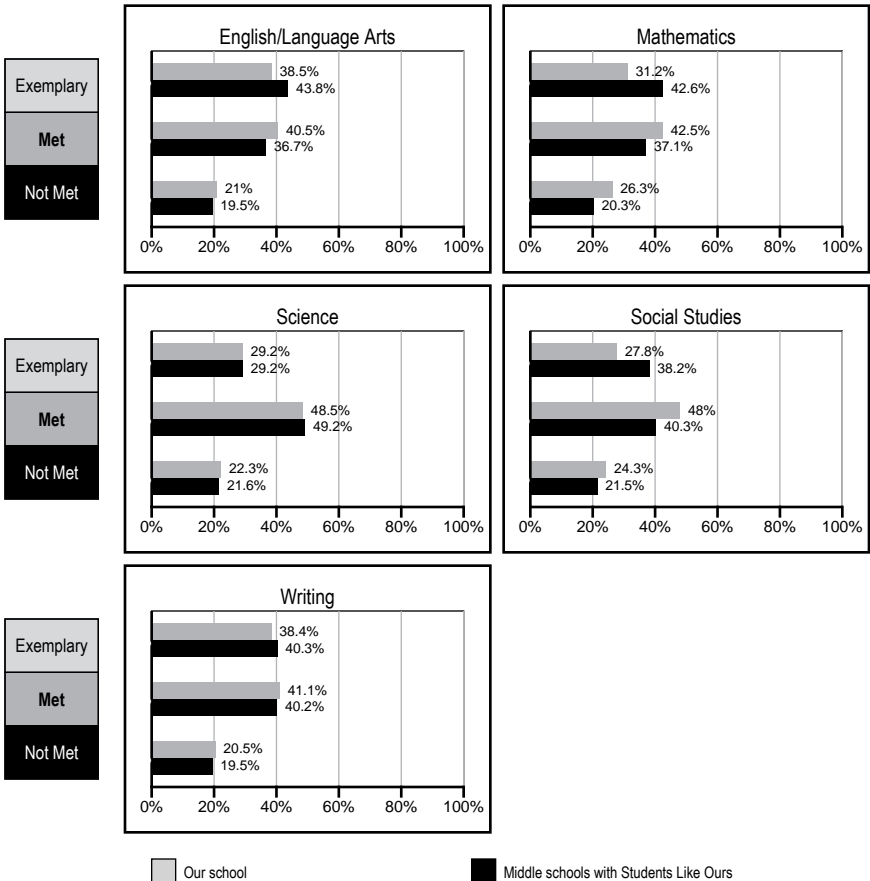

## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This is our first year of taking the new test, Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS), and we will continue to analyze that information as well. Our teachers are Highly Qualified as defined by the No Child Left Behind Act, and thirteen of our teachers are National Board Certified Teachers.
