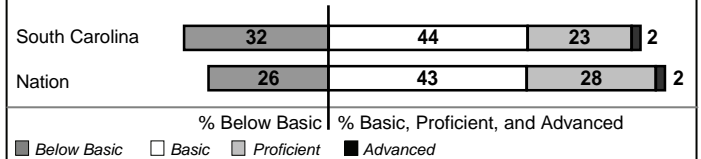

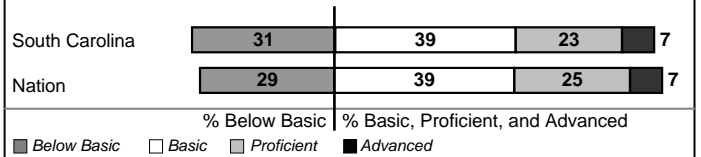

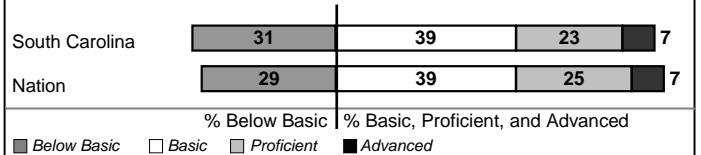
READING – GRADE 8 (2009)

REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2009-2010 year was a very successful year. The CNA program had a 100% passing rate for state testing. We have two students attending Nationals in HOSA and one HVAC student competing in Nationals. We also met all eight Perkins standards.

We have continued to work in partnership with Piedmont Technical College to offer articulation agreements for students. We have increased our dual credit classes. We replaced two of our computer labs with more advanced equipment. Our student population continued to grow.

We are proud of our Present and previous accomplishments. Maintaining high-quality instructors with cutting-edge equipment and technology is a must. Current budget shortfalls make this difficult, but our students and teachers are being successful in spite of this variable.
