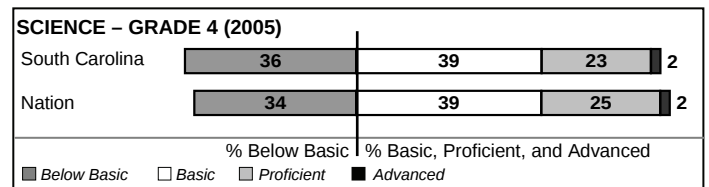
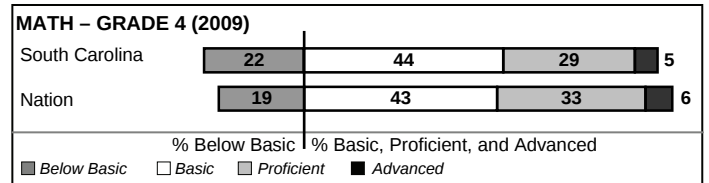
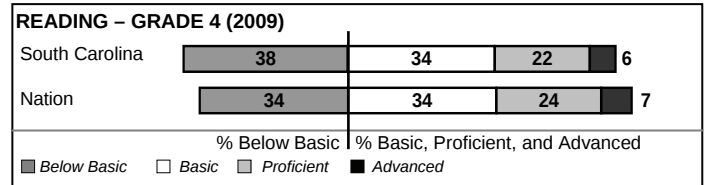
PASS PERFORMANCE
