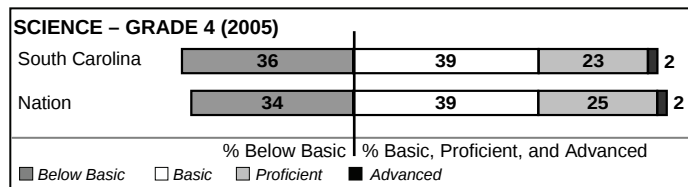
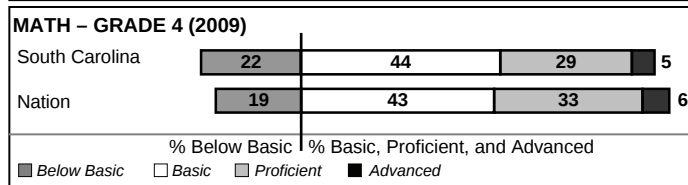
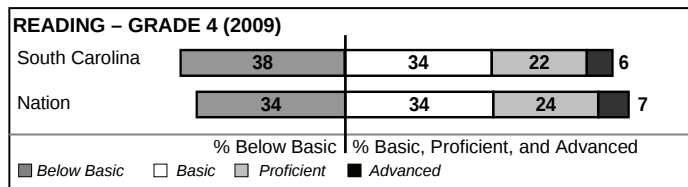
PASS PERFORMANCE
