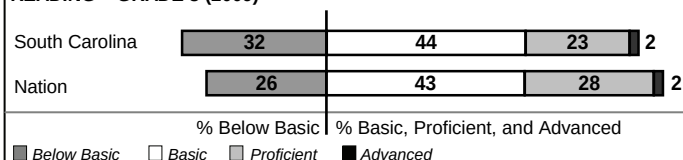

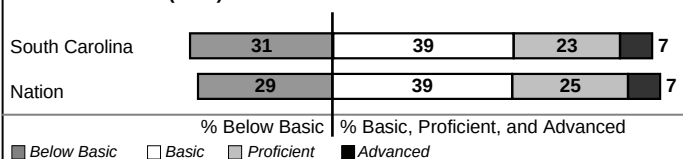

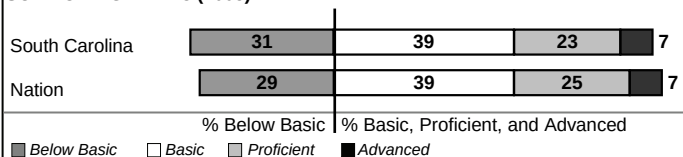
READING - GRADE 8 (2009)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Rock Hill High School students have been successful in class and extracurricular activities this year, earning state and national honors in academics, the arts, athletics, and club and service organizations. Twenty-five students earned academic honors at the state level, and nine advanced to national competitions. In the arts, students earned thirty-five individual recognitions, and the Band of Distinction placed third in the state 5A marching band competition. Students performed in All State choral and instrumental ensembles. Over six hundred students competed on school athletic teams, with seventeen signed to play college sports.

Students and faculty also contributed many service hours and raised \$15,916 for relief and charitable projects locally and internationally. Out of 447 graduating seniors, 234 earned LIFE scholarships and 20 earned Palmetto Fellows scholarships. The grand total of all scholarships offered to graduates was a record-breaking \$6.1 million dollars.

Faculty members were awarded \$4,355 in grant funding, and four more teachers earned National Board certification. All faculty and staff continued to focus on improving students' achievement on End of Course, HSAP, and SAT testing and will continue to work with students to provide the best education possible.
