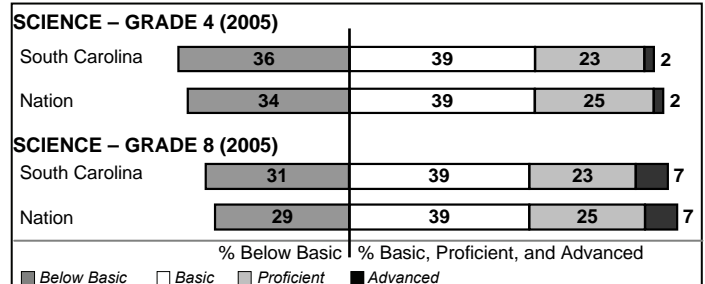
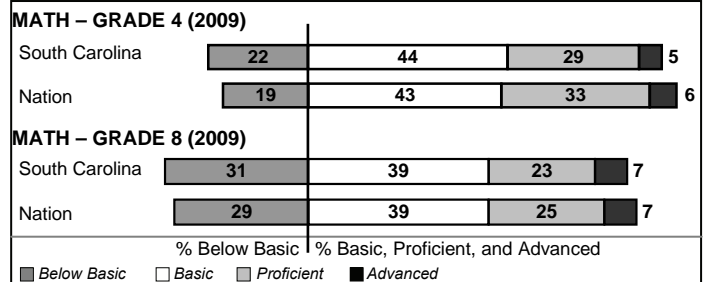
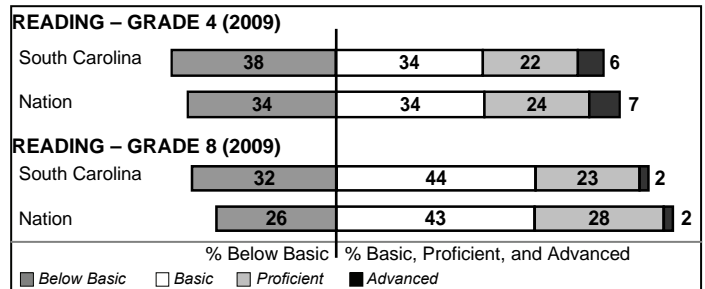

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of the Greenwood School District 50 Early Childhood Center is to provide a strong educational foundation in a safe and nurturing environment that instills a love of learning through family and community partnerships. This year was very successful for our students due to the continued support and encouragement of our faculty and staff, our families and the community!

Our center served 329 students this year with 63 students in our Montessori program, 242 students in our child development program and 24 in our self-contained preschool classes. Sixty-one percent of our students qualify for free or reduced lunch. Our center is culturally diverse with one third of our students being Hispanic, one third African-American and one third Caucasian.

The Capable, Unique and Busy Students (CUBS) at ECC participated in several service learning projects. The CUBS raised \$2460 for the United Way, \$233 for March of Dimes, \$1162 for Relay for Life, \$1457 for Hearts for Haiti and collected 432 canned goods for the soup kitchen.

Parents participated with their students during two family CUB Times—Mother Goose's Nursery Rhymes and the Ocean. Birthday brunches and lunches gave parents an opportunity to celebrate birthdays with their children. Grandparents' Day offered our grandparents an occasion to visit our center. An English class for non-English speaking parents met twice weekly to assist parents wishing to learn English. The center hosted two book fairs to provide books for the students and their families. We used the book, Have You Filled a Bucket Today, by Carol McCloud to teach children how to use kind and positive word to build others' self-esteem and fill their "buckets."

The teachers elected Mrs. Shannon Balentine as the Teacher of the Year (2010-11) for Greenwood Early Childhood Center. Mrs. Edith Bryan was chosen as the Office Max "A Day Made Better 2009" Program. She received over \$1000 worth of supplies and materials for her classroom.

We wish to thank our parents and the School Improvement Council members for their support and encouragement this year! We will continue to "Grow Everyone into a Caring Citizen!"
