Report of Director and School Improvement Council

Barnwell County Career Center (BCCC) is one of eleven multi-district career centers in South Carolina. BCCC serves students from Barnwell School Districts 19, 29, and 45. BCCC had an enrollment of 568 participating in twelve career programs in 2010-2011.

Seventy-three students were involved in School-to-Work activities. Activities included cooperative learning at thirteen different sites, shadowing local businesses and participating in clinicals at various medical sites in the local area. BCCC also continues to provide School Based Enterprise opportunities for the school year. Twenty-eight students participated in the School Based Enterprise. Shadowing experiences were provided for eight Cosmetology students, as well as additional shadowing opportunities for middle school students from the feeder schools.

Sixty-nine students were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society. Students were involved in a variety of organizations, such as SkillsUSA, HOSA, DECA, FFA, and FCCLA. Membership in these organizations allows students to participate in regional, state, and national competitions in their program of study. Four students participated in the SkillsUSA competition in Greenville, SC, where one student earned Second Place in the state Cosmetology contest and another student earned Fourth Place in the state Criminal Justice contest. Thirty students attended the State HOSA convention in Charleston where one student won a silver medal, two students won bronze medals, and one student earned a fourth place in another competition. One student competed in the state FCCLA competition, where she won first place gold in the Life Event Planning competition. Thirty-one students earned national/industry certification during the 2010-2011 school year.

The FFA chapter at BCCC continues to be involved in many community activities. The chapter sponsored another High School Rodeo event in the fall. Students attended numerous FFA events. Grants and awards amounting to \$4700 were won by the FFA program. Students attended the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis.

BCCC had a total of 102 students from the three district high schools who completed training at the center. Of the 2010 Career and Technology completers eligible for placement, 97.4% were placed in secondary programs, the military, or gainful employment.
