Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

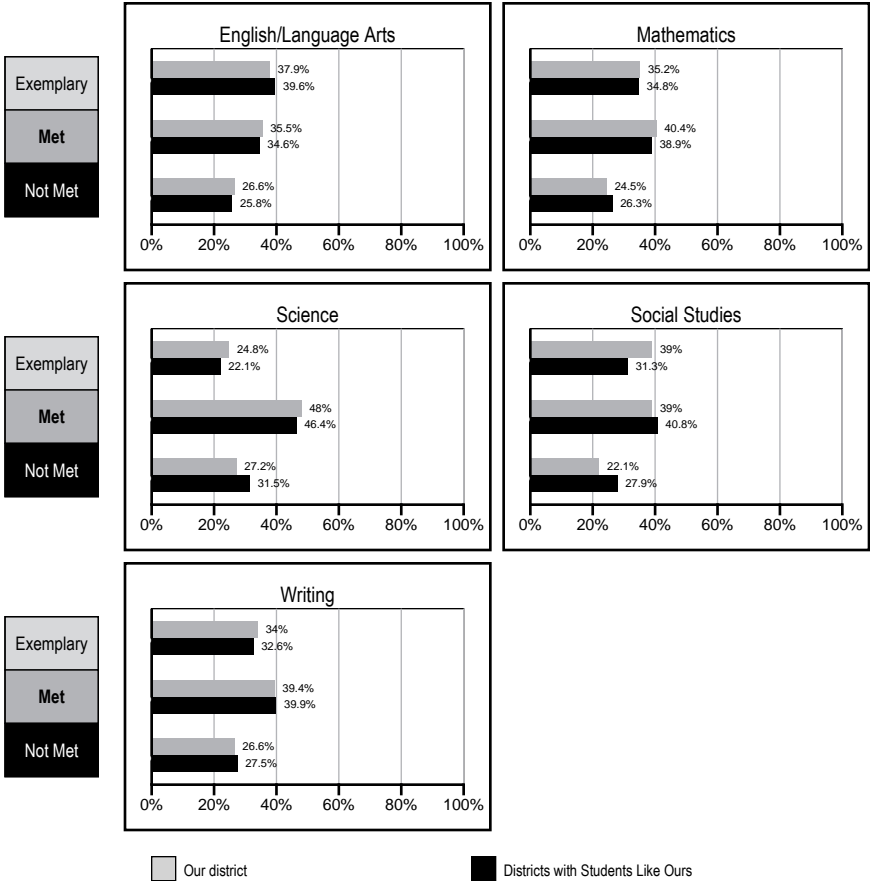

District Superintendent's Report

The 2010-2011 school year has been a year filled with anticipation, excitement, and fulfillment through academics, athletics, and a long over-due renovation and construction program in Bamberg School District One. A new five-year District Strategic Plan has been developed, as well as new School Renewal Plans for Richard Carroll Primary (RCPS), Richard Carroll Elementary (RCES), Bamberg-Ehrhardt Middle (BEMS), and Bamberg-Ehrhardt High Schools (BEHS). Having set high goals for each of the plans will provide a strong, intense framework for the district to continue its climb to academic success. Three schools in the district made AYP for the year – RCPS, RCES, and BEHS –with BEMS and the district missing this distinction by one goal. I believe this indicates a strong commitment by faculty, staff and administration to continue the journey to academic excellence, even in light of the poorly funded mandates imposed on districts by the state. As always, we will continue to strive and thrive in the face of adversity.

Bamberg School District One continues to place a strong emphasis on early intervention by working diligently through our CHILD FIND services to identify all children who need services at a young age. A close collaboration with Baby Net ensures that there are no gaps in services for these special children. Our 4K/CDEPP program is second to none, preparing our children to enter 5K at or near grade level. Grades 1-3 at RCPS are constantly pursuing strategies and techniques through different training avenues offered through Title I funding. RCES, for the third year in a row, has received the Silver Award from the SDE because of academic achievement and for 'closing the gap' between ethnic groups on PASS testing. BEMS had the opportunity of working with a technical assistance coach on a part-time basis throughout this school year, and her expertise, primarily in the areas of ELA and Social Studies, was well received and reflected in PASS scores in these two areas. BEHS continues to move forward in the High Schools That Work model. Electronic Individual Graduation Plans (eIGPs) were completed at the rate of 100%, a goal that has been achieved since the implementations of these plans.

Our Office of Exceptional children is as strong as it has been in many years. The graduating class of 2011 had more students who were products of the special education program to graduate with a high school diploma than ever in the history of the school. Our teachers and administration in this very important program have high expectations for their students, expecting and accepting only the highest quality work that each can produce. Response to Intervention (RtI) is well underway in all grades and we are seeing the fruits of 'our labor' as students begin to close academic gaps.

Our Construction/Renovation program is well underway. The Middle School and the High School will be ready for occupancy in August 2011 with various phases of work continuing until total completion of all construction which is scheduled for August 2012. There is excitement in the air as these projects move forward.

We believe that 'Bamberg One is the place to be!'
