Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

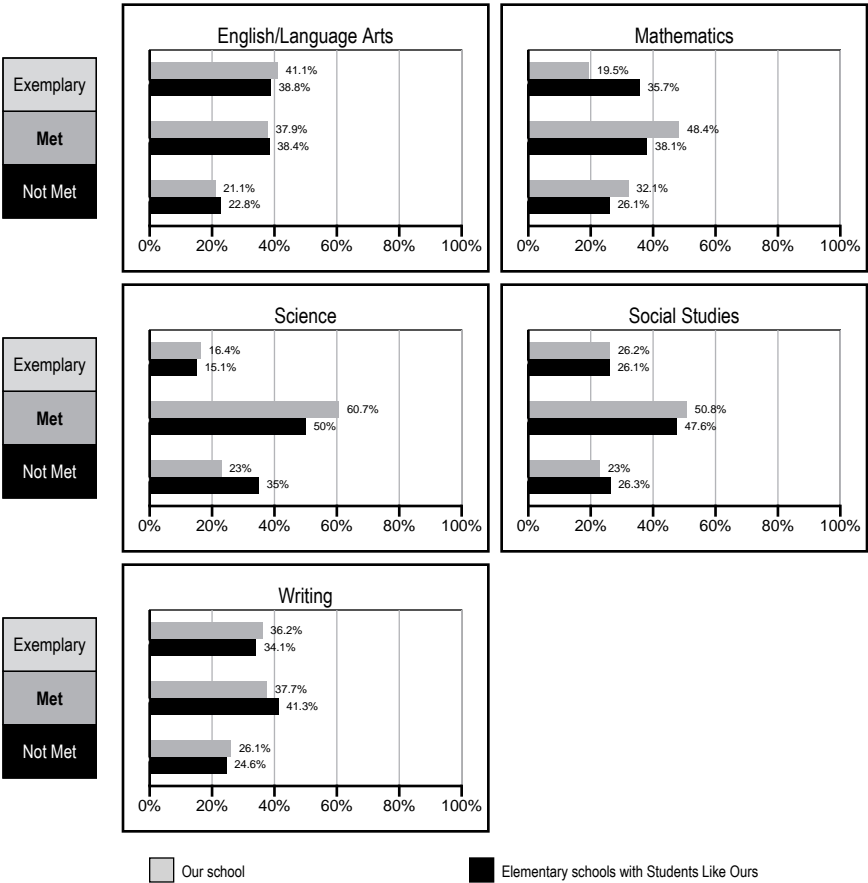

Iva Elementary has had another busy and productive school year. Iva Elementary is very fortunate to have a supportive PTO that works diligently to foster closer relations between home and school. Many parents spend hours giving of their time, energy, and resources to help Iva succeed in all areas.
