Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

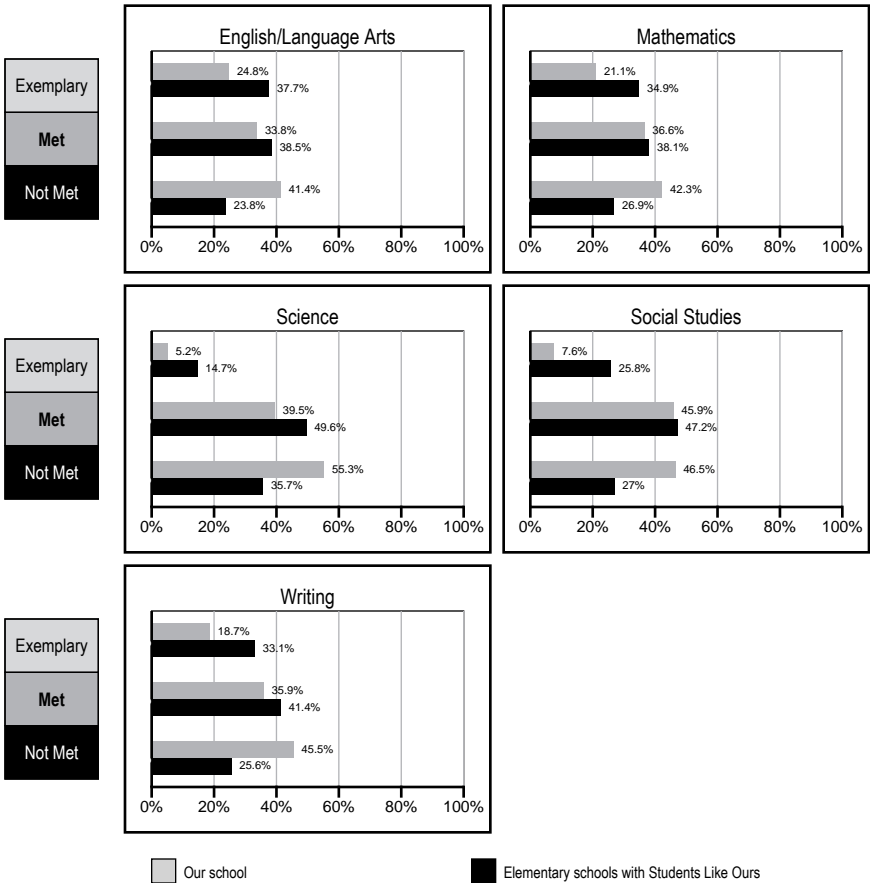

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Barnwell Elementary School is a rural school serving 574 students in grades four through six.

The faculty of Barnwell Elementary School continues to use data from MAP, PASS, and common assessments to drive the curriculum. Data walls were displayed in the hallways, as well as pledge cards signed by students stating ways to do their best.

Students were excited to use the newly acquired SMART Response Systems during their classes. Barnwell Elementary continues to increase the technology available and its use. Students also used Study Island in reading, math, science, and social studies. The technology program, iCORE, was also integrated into classroom instruction.

The year has been busy and productive. The fourth and fifth grade students went on field studies correlated to the grade level standards. The fourth grade attended Colonial Times, and fifth grade enjoyed experiencing history at Patriot's Point. Other field studies were also enjoyed throughout the year. All students enjoyed the visit and performance by Chris Rumble, author and illustrator. The fifth grade participated in D.A.R.E., and G.R.E.A.T. classes were held for fourth and sixth grades. Barnwell Elementary also had four book clubs and two reading incentive programs.

We continue to work closely with out PTO and SIC in sponsoring family events such as the Fall Carnival, BINGO nights, MAP night, and other family information events.
