

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Goals and Objectives

Faculty Council, School Improvement Council, PTA, and students worked together to establish a clear direction for the 2010-2011 school year. Using the Education Plan of Greenville County Schools as a framework, Oakview set goals for improvement. Increasing the number of students scoring Exemplary or Met on PASS Math, ELA, Science, and Social Studies represent just a few of the goal areas. Accomplishments for 2010-2011

Students continued to maintain a high level of achievement as measured by test scores. Data from curriculum based assessments were used to evaluate progress at K5 and 1st grade. First grade through fifth grade students were also assessed using a variety of instruments including AIMSWEB, ITBS, CogAT, MAP, and/or PASS. PASS results from prior years show Oakview to be performing near the top of the state when compared to schools like ours. In recognition of this continued high achievement, the school received its tenth consecutive Palmetto Gold Award. Oakview also received a Closing the Gap Silver Award in recognition of the performance levels of African American students and students on free and reduced meals. Teachers received over \$4,000 in grants to carry out innovative instructional strategies in their classrooms. Partnering with PTA, the school purchased wireless handheld devices which communicate with classroom interactive whiteboards! Oakview received a Safe Schools Award for the sixth consecutive year from Upstate Safe Kids. The school continued its service to the community by recycling aluminum cans, which has garnered over \$18,000 for the S.C. Burned Children's Fund over the years. PTA and community members logged over 22,000 volunteer hours to support school programs. Oakview's PTA was a state finalist for Unit of the Year by the South Carolina PTA and received numerous awards at this year's convention.

Plans for the Future

In preparation for 2011-2012, Oakview plans to expand its offerings related to student health and wellness. A "fun run," Fitness Night, and a new cafeteria menu are all in the works! With an established Strategic Plan, the school will continue to focus on goals for improved student performance, while at the same time, teaching the "whole child." Together, we anticipate success as we fulfill Oakview's mission!
