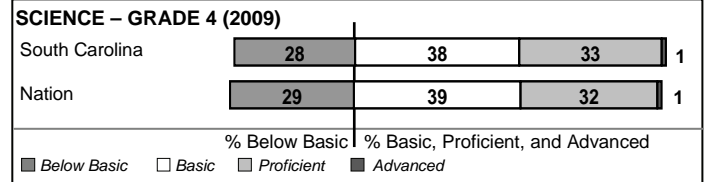
## PASS PERFORMANCE
