Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

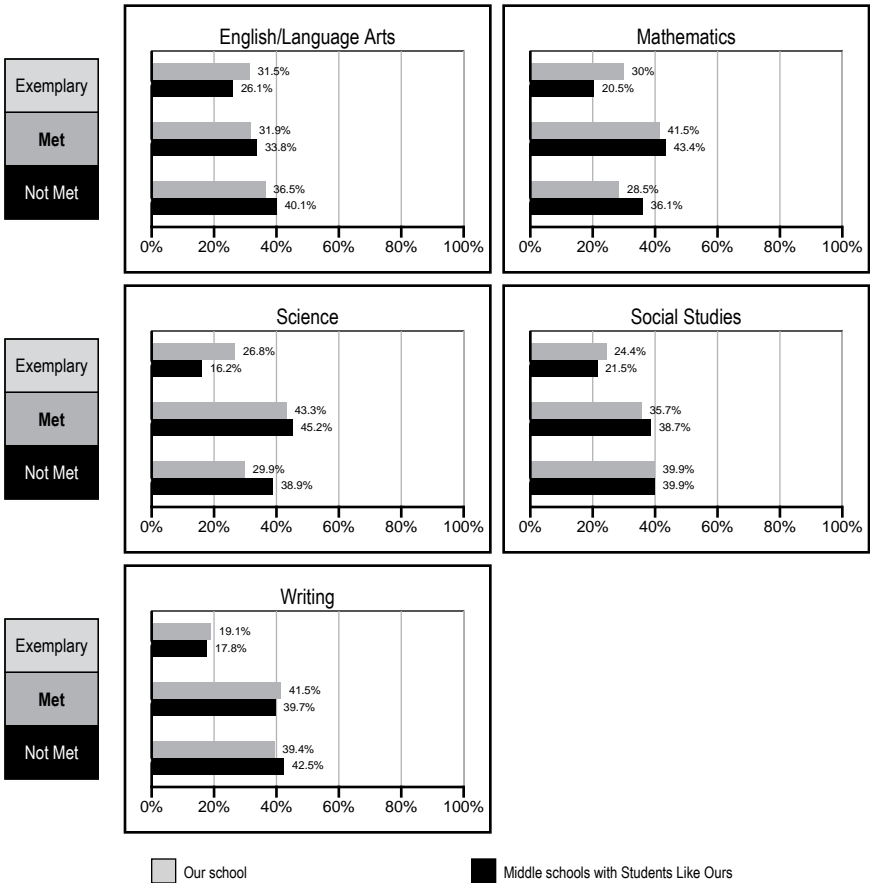

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Green Sea Floyds Middle & High School made significant strides in 2010-11. Our senior class of seventy-six graduates accumulated an impressive one million dollars plus in scholarships that included twenty LIFE scholarship recipients, eight HOPE scholarship recipients, and four Palmetto Fellows recipients. Our graduating class has a multitude of aspirations which range from attending two-year colleges, attending four-year colleges, seeking immediate employment, and joining the armed forces.

The administration, teachers, and staff worked diligently to ensure our students are properly prepared to compete in a global society. Teachers used Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) data to drive instruction addressing student weaknesses while capitalizing on their strengths. Middle school students made impressive MAP gains which indicate future academic success. Additionally, all ninth and tenth grade students were served in yearlong English and math classes in an effort to afford them daily, intensive, and explicit standards based instruction to fully prepare them for high stakes assessments such as HSAP and EOCT.

The US News and World Report recognized GSFHS as one of "America's Best High Schools" for the third year in a row. GSFHS was also recognized as a High Performance award winner for improvements on the SAT and ACT tests, a Closing the Achievement Gap award winner, as well as the middle school being recognized as a Palmetto Silver award winner for outstanding student academic performance. The Green Sea Floyds High School Future Farmers of America finished first in the State Agronomy Contest and the top three scorers were all GSFHS students. Several students participated in on-line courses and our athletic teams enjoyed many outstanding moments, including the lady's tennis team winning the Lower State title and the boys baseball team competing for the Lower State title.

Our continuous goals involve increasing graduation rates and improving student achievement and attendance. The school has worked hard to make 2010-11 a successful year and anticipates even greater results in 2011-12.
