Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

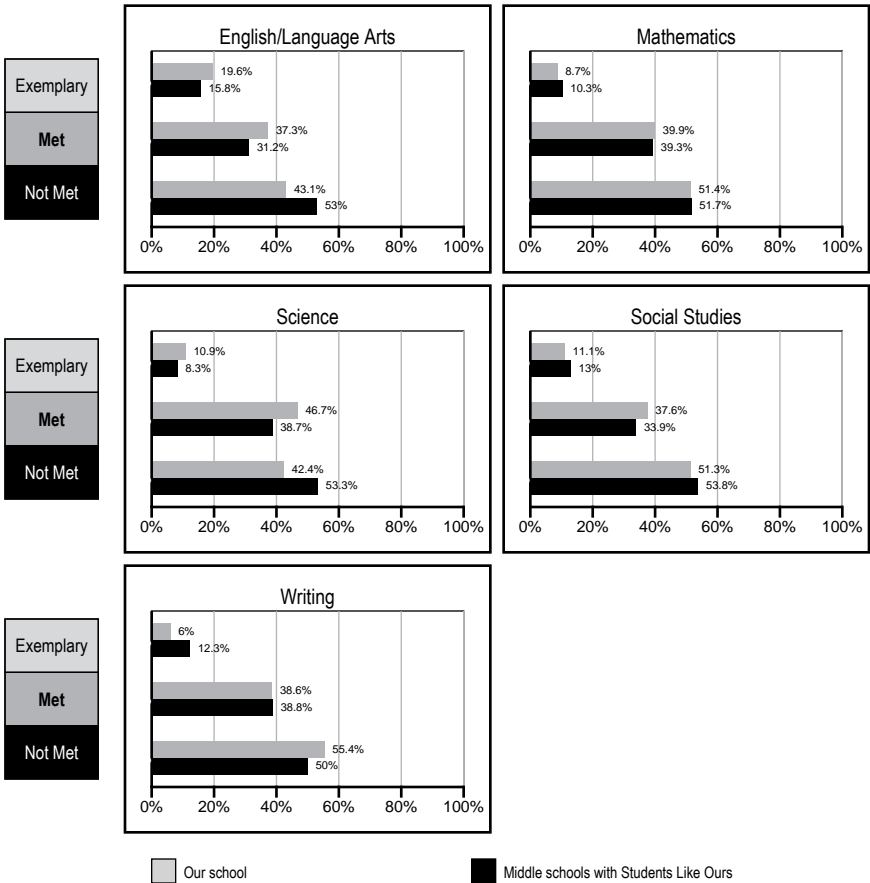

With the start of the 2010-2011 year, a new school was introduced to the Williamsburg County School District. Hemingway Middle School Annex, located in Hemingway, South Carolina, serves students in grades sixth through eighth. Our motto is "Academic Excellence Is Our Ultimate Goal." During this transition, the faculty, staff, and students continued to strive for academic excellence, our ultimate goal.

Hemingway Middle School Annex offers high-quality education for all of the students with highly qualified teachers. Qualifying students can enroll in high school credit classes, including English 1, Algebra 1 and Keyboarding. The state end-of-course results for 2010 showed that our students in English 1 had a 100 % passage rate.

Outside of the classroom, our students participate in a number of organizations, clubs, and sports, including Student Council, Academic Challenge, Beta Club, Science Club, and Math Club. Our B-team football, B-team girls' basketball, and B-team boys' basketball all won their respective season championships during the 2010-2011 school year.
