Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

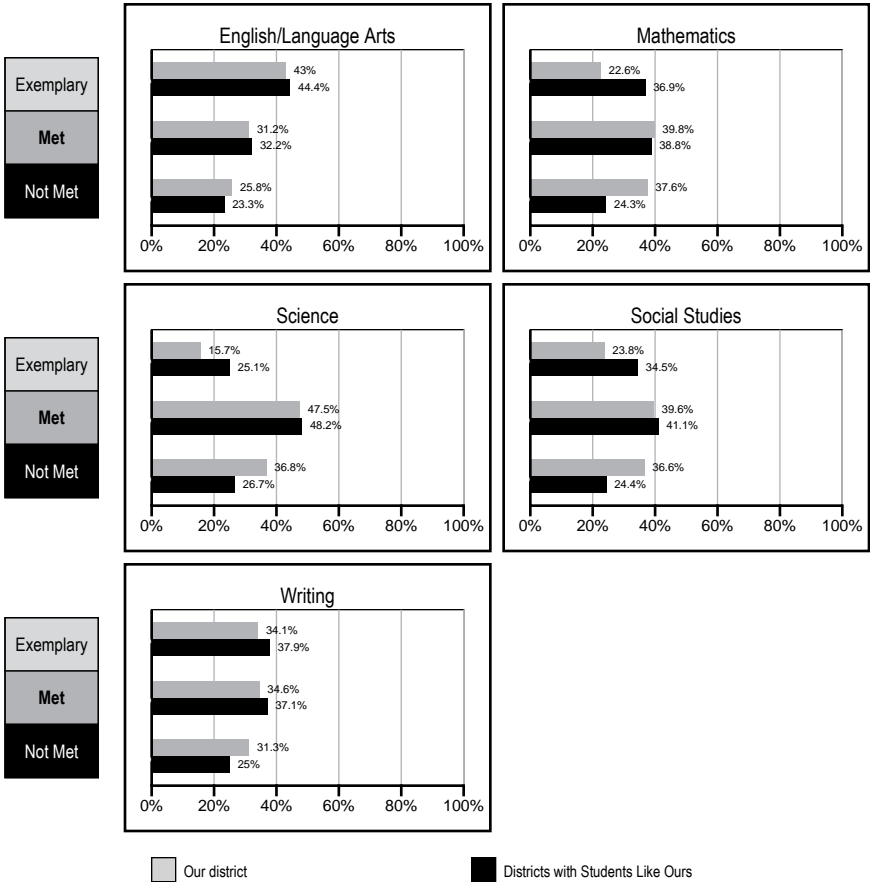

District Superintendent's Report

The 2011-2012 school year was the fourth year of operation for the district and another growth period. The district went from almost 9,000 students in eleven schools to nearly 10,000 students in thirteen schools. The district also prepared for the opening of four more schools in August 2012: Cape Romain Environmental Education Charter School in McClellanville, Royal Live Oaks Academy of the Arts and Sciences Charter School in Hardeeville, Youth Leadership Academy in Pickens, and Imagine Columbia Leadership Academy. In addition, the district staff prepared to receive Fox Creek High School through a transfer that will be effective July 1, 2012. With the increase in schools and students for the 2011-2012 school year, the district office hired one additional staff member, raising the total number of district office personnel to twelve, for a ratio of over 830 students per district office employee.

True to the nature of public charter schools, the 2011-2012 academic year saw an emphasis on accountability. The operation of each school in the district was closely measured against the school's official charter agreement. This scrutiny included an analysis of student performance results on the 2010-2011 state standardized tests and other high-stakes considerations. As a result of that scrutiny, the charters for four schools in the district were placed on probationary status for 2011-2012. The charter for one of those schools was subsequently revoked.

In contrast, Palmetto Scholars Academy in Charleston, York Preparatory Academy in Rock Hill, and Spartanburg Charter School all achieved impressive student success rates on 2010-2011 state standardized testing. Other schools in the district are working to improve student outcomes. Of particular concern are the needs of at-risk students, who have chosen to access the virtual learning schools in large numbers.

Preparations for the changeover to common core standards, targeted responses to high school graduation rates, and further improvements to the management of student data rounded out some of the major initiatives of the schools of the district for 2011-12.

Funding for the schools in the district increased over 2010-2011, though the funding level remains roughly half of the national average and well below the state average. The lack of any funding for student transportation and the lack of funding or support for any school facilities both continue to be major challenges for the current and future schools in the district. Despite these issues, interest in developing new public charter schools remains high. As many as 11 new public charter schools could open through the district in 2013.
