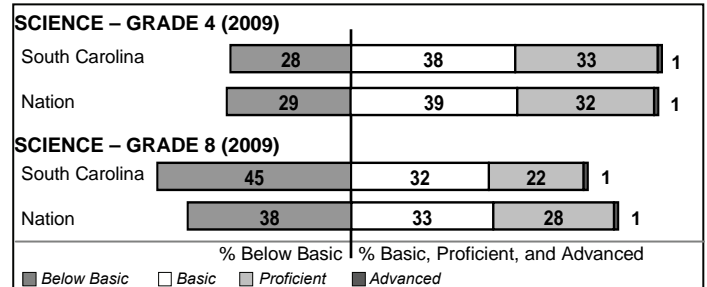
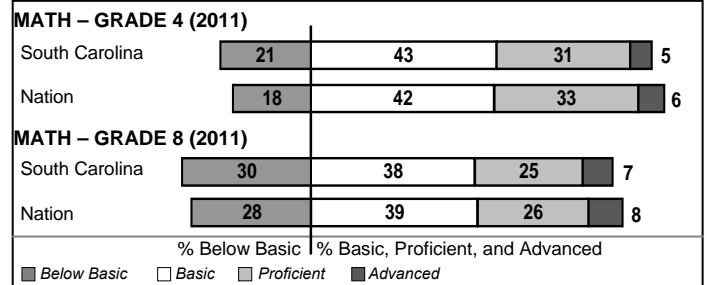
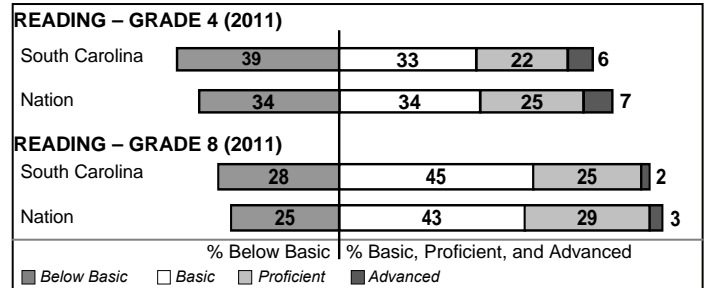

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Thank you for taking the time to look over our district report card. It contains valuable information concerning our student performance indicators. The Board of Trustees and administration appreciate your involvement in and support for our schools.

You will note that District Two has achieved a great deal of academic success as measured by our student achievement results on the various state tests. All fourteen of our schools earned Palmetto Gold or Silver Awards last year and received "absolute" ratings of Good or Excellent on the state report card. We were proud that the total amount of scholarship money earned by the Class of 2012 was an all-time high of \$17.7 million. Our athletic teams continue to be competitive and our visual and performing arts programs have been recognized near and far for their success.

Our efforts in classroom instruction have focused this past year in several key areas: Elementary classroom teachers have been trained to utilize guided reading strategies to help our students in a more individualized way with their reading skills. All schools have implemented "Response to Intervention" teams to address learning issues with individual students. As a result, our referrals for special services have been greatly reduced as we meet learning needs in the regular classrooms. We continue to improve in our ability to provide differentiated instruction based on student results in every classroom.

We continue to address facility needs in order to provide excellent and equitable learning environments for our students. Some recent projects include the expansion of the cafeteria and kitchen area at Boiling Springs High School, renovation of the science labs at the Boiling Springs Ninth Grade campus, and a \$4.2 million expansion at Swofford Career Center in partnership with Spartanburg One. We have also extended parking lots and access roads at several schools to provide a safer drop-off and pick-up situation for parents. The Board and administration continually monitor our facility needs and make improvements as we plan for the future.

Five advisory councils meet with the superintendent and staff quarterly to provide and receive information on current issues facing the schools. Members of the local business community, parents, teachers, support staff, and students advise us on ideas and initiatives.

Spartanburg School District Two is a wonderful place to live, work and learn. The presence of faith and strong families enable us to more easily educate your children. Thank you for choosing to live here and for partnering with us in this most important endeavor.
