Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

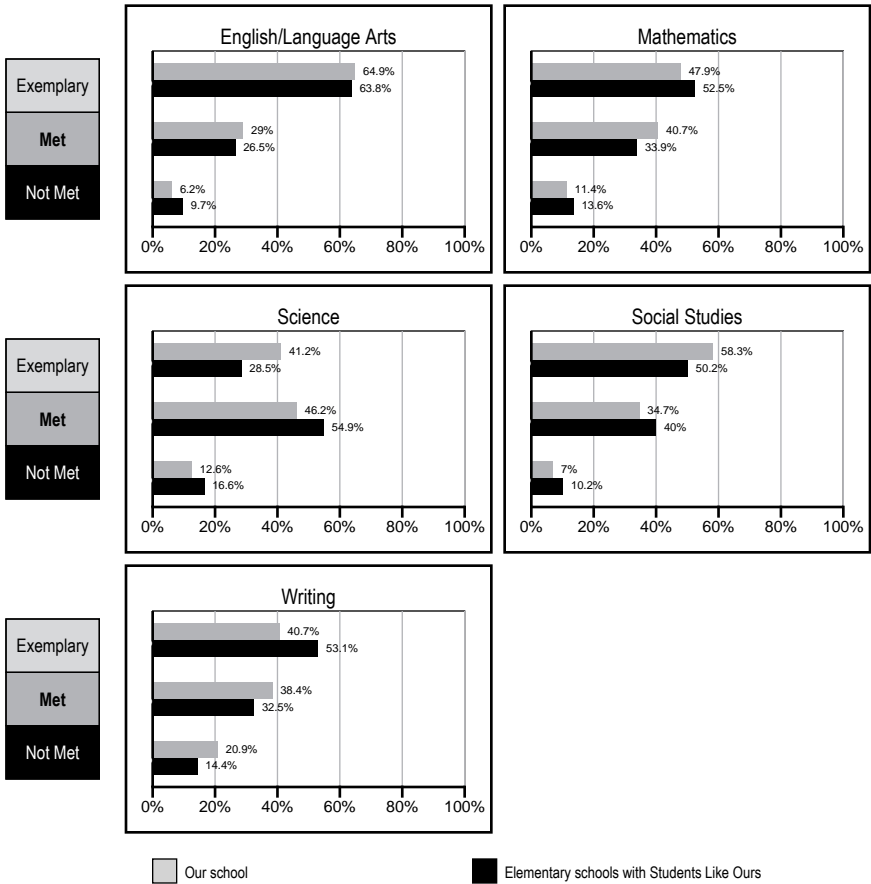

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The mission of the Powdersville Elementary community is to strive to promote life-long learning in every student and to ensure a positive, challenging, and safe learning environment. This mission is exemplified in our school motto, "Powdersville Elementary, P R I D E: Producing Responsible Individuals while Developing Excellence." Character Education is essential in developing responsible students. Each day a new character word is introduced by our news anchors on our student operated news program, WTLP. We're The Lion Pride network, and our teachers integrate those character words into their classroom instruction.

Our theme for the 2011 -2012 school year was "Gill's Galaxy of Learners: Blasting Off to Success". The school was decorated in a space theme, complete with our own mission control and navigating astronaut. Each teacher's classroom was transformed into his/her own "launch pad" from which the students began their journey! Our "Shoot for the Stars" bulletin board with examples of students exemplifying good character, our "Citizen of the Month" display and our grade level displays of student work were favorites throughout the year.

Powdersville Elementary worked together and achieved great things this year! We are very proud to have been named as a 2010 National Blue Ribbon School! This year we received the Palmetto Gold Award for both general performance and for closing the achievement gap.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
