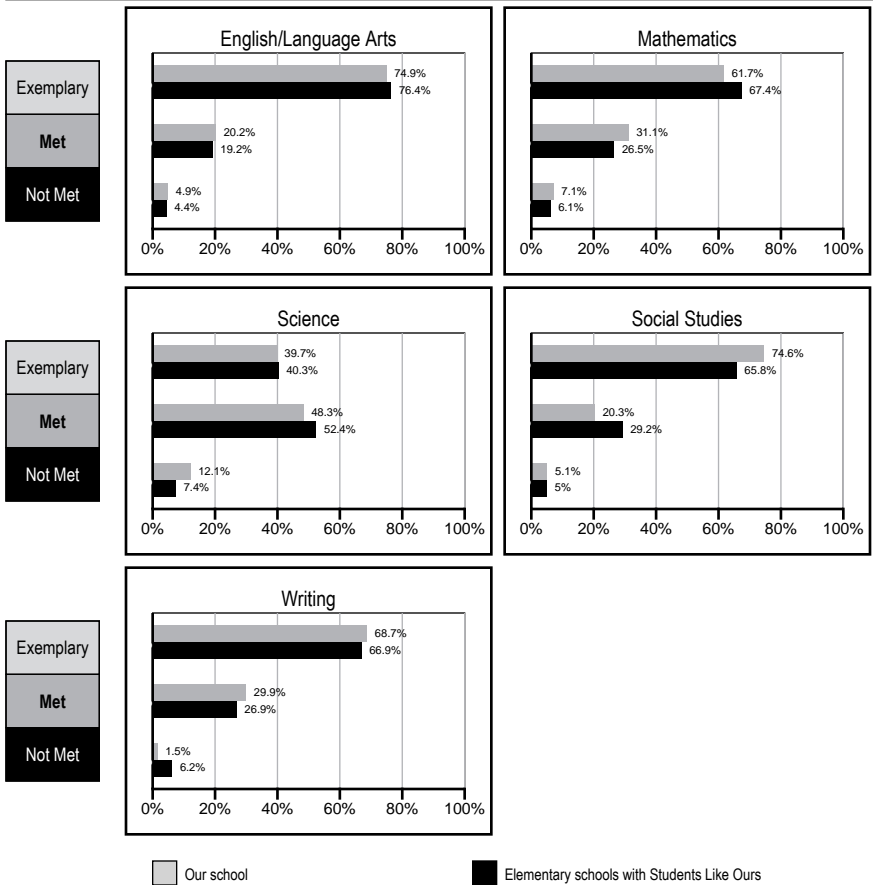

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This narrative has been prepared to share information from the 2011-2012 school year and to project ahead toward the current school year, 2012-2013.

Sullivan's Island Elementary School is now embarking upon its second year as a partial magnet school, providing school choice to students outside of the customary attendance zone. As we continue our time-honored tradition of academic achievement; we now place an instructional emphasis on mathematics, science and the coastal environment.

During the introductory year of the partial magnet we successfully provided access to an elementary appropriate math/science lab, obtained science/math materials and implemented science/math field trips and projects. This year the science and math lab will be staffed by a full time teacher. Our fundamental goal is to steadily improve student learning in all areas, with significant increases in math and science.

I am pleased to report that for the 2011 school year our school received an Excellent/Excellent State rating. We also met our Annual Yearly Progress Goals (AYP) and were named a Palmetto Gold School.

The Parent Teacher Association, Friends of Sullivan's Island School, and the School Improvement Council have each served an integral role in connecting community, faculty and parents to create positive change in education. In 2011/2012 we raised funds to support critical staffing positions and programs, such as, Spanish, guidance, technology and intervention. These programs impact all students on a daily basis and support the Sullivan Island Elementary philosophy of educating the whole child.

We are now entering our third year in the former Whiteside's Elementary facility. This past summer our former building on Sullivan's Island, which was seismically unsafe, was finally demolished. We now await progress on the new state-of-the-art-building, designed for our math and science program and the 21st century student!

In conclusion, we are very proud of our students' accomplishments in the past, present and future. It is an exciting time to be a part of Sullivan's Island Elementary School!

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
