

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Windsor Hill Arts Infused Elementary School serves students in 4K through fifth grades. We aim to meet the needs of every child by providing meaningful opportunities through arts infused, technology based, and differentiated learning experiences. As an Exemplar PBIS School, we are proud of our positive and proactive school culture.

As an arts focus school for Dorchester School District Two, Windsor Hill welcomes students from outside our attendance lines to participate in the arts integrated curriculum offered at our school. For the second time, we were named an Arts in Basic Curriculum School in 2012. Our students participate in two-dimensional and three-dimensional art, vocal and instrumental music, team and individual sports, as well as dance and drama classes throughout each school year. Before and after school programs such as African drumming, chorus, WHAIES News Show, and Smart STEPpers allow students to explore specific arts interests and gifts. Our students have been invited to perform in the community at events such as the Boeing Dreamliner Grand Opening and Piccolo Spoleto.

Windsor Hill houses four up-to-date computer labs as well as a mobile lab offering 30 laptop computers for classroom use. SMART Boards, LCD projectors, Airliners, and SMART Response Systems are also at use on a daily basis in our classrooms. Students and teachers have access to more than 50 iPads for instructional and learning apps and projects.

Academic programs help all students reach their maximum potential. Self-contained gifted and talented classes serve students in grades 3-5. Intervention programs serve students in grades 1-5 that need reading and math support. Behavioral and academic achievements are rewarded and celebrated at A Honor Roll ceremonies and Terrific Kids celebrations.

Windsor Hill Hawks SOAR each and every day. Students learn the school expectations for Safety, Organization, Achievement, and Respect in all areas of our school. These skills are practiced and reinforced when students earn SOAR coins that they can spend on our SOAR cart that is stocked with high interest items for all students.

Through work with the PTA Board, School Improvement Council, fifty-five business partners, community members, parents, and our school faculty, Windsor Hill focuses on student achievement and success.

Professional development is given to teachers that is data-driven and specific to the needs of Windsor Hill teachers and students. Parents are involved in key decisions regarding the Title I Plan. We work together to provide an environment that creates lifelong learners.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
