

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

In this house, Beacons shine! We cultivate student success through our Lighthouses of Lifelong Learning encouraging students to CREATE, NURTURE, CONNECT and DREAM. With an "All Hands on Deck" mindset, teachers, parents, business partners and volunteers work to develop true relationships with students and with each other. Beacons are expected to SHINE as a part of our Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) focus. Beacons are Safe, Honest, Intelligent, Nurturing and Empowered (SHINE). As we shine, we also grow. We are challenged to respond to rapidly increasing enrollment and the wide, diverse needs of our students.

Named as a 2012 TD Bank Palmetto's Finest School, Beech Hill was also featured as a "Cool School" by WCIV-Channel 2. We are the home of this year's district Teacher of the Year, another Teacher of the Year recognized by the Summerville Patch newspaper and a "Good Apple Award" recipient from WCSC-Channel 5. Our school representative finished second in the district's Spelling Bee. The 4th Grade Math Team placed second in the district's Math is Cool Competition, while both our 3rd and 4th Grade Quiz Bowl teams won district contests. Our participating kindergarten class placed second in the Citadel's STEM Innovation Challenge and the Robo Ninja Girls won the district's Robotics competition. We were recognized by the Charleston Post and Courier for our exemplary BoxTops program and are the recipients of a GenMove Grant sponsored by McDonalds.

The "Beacon Experience" is rich with events that promote community, spirit and pride. In addition to eleven after-school clubs like Juggling, Spanish and Line Dancing, Beacons participate in WERD clubs. These clubs, conducted on Wednesday Early Release Days, afford students opportunities to explore topics like cake decorating, sign language and bead-making. Clubs like At-Your-Service and Beacon Buddies provide avenues for service learning and community connections. Events such as Camp Invention, STEM initiatives and Market Day promote innovation and creativity. Clubs like The Beat at the Beech Drumline, Recycling or Fit at the Beech are examples of student-driven initiatives. Beacons CONNECT with the community through events like Caps for Caring, Jump Rope for Heart, Relay for Life, Miracle League and Pennies for Patients.

Beacons lead daily school operations with PBIS SHINE Patrol, Beacon Flag Bearers, WBHS Morning Show Crew and Students Working As Techs (SWAT) team. They exchange ideas, voice concerns and develop action plans through Student Leadership Council and the Leadership Summit. Events like Autumn Daze, Camp Read and Write, Grand Beacons Night and SMART Night extend involvement to include family and community. In this lighthouse, Beacons shine brightly at the "Beech."

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
