

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Numerous programs are available to students to provide creative outlets and to promote positive character development. Students may be involved in activities such as Relay for Life Events, Drama Club, Art Therapy, BEARS exercise program, Girls on the Run, Kindergarten Chorus, Elementary Chorus, Study Buddies, A.C.E. Club, Student Council, Junior Achievement, Choral Festival, Reading Counts, E-mail Pals, and the Babbling Bears Morning Program.

Continuous improvement in statewide testing has occurred each year that PASS has been administered. Our focus continues to be to provide opportunities for academic improvement by engaging students in learning before, during, and after school. Some activities offered before or after school include the following: math lab, writing programs, fitness programs, Homework Center, and computer classes. By offering additional programs, we are able to expand instruction of curriculum standards and offer assistance to students who need additional help while offering more challenging activities to others.

Our faculty and staff continue to become stronger as they take advantage of the many professional development opportunities. All teachers completed training in numerous technology initiatives, and many took graduate courses to further their education. We strive to provide quality instruction while maintaining an atmosphere that encourages individual differences and allows students to just be children.

Supportive parents, enthusiastic students, and creative teachers make our atmosphere one of playfulness and friendliness. Our welcome mat sums up our beliefs and supports our mission statement as it reads, "Little People, Big Dreams, and Bright Futures at Erwin Elementary."

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
