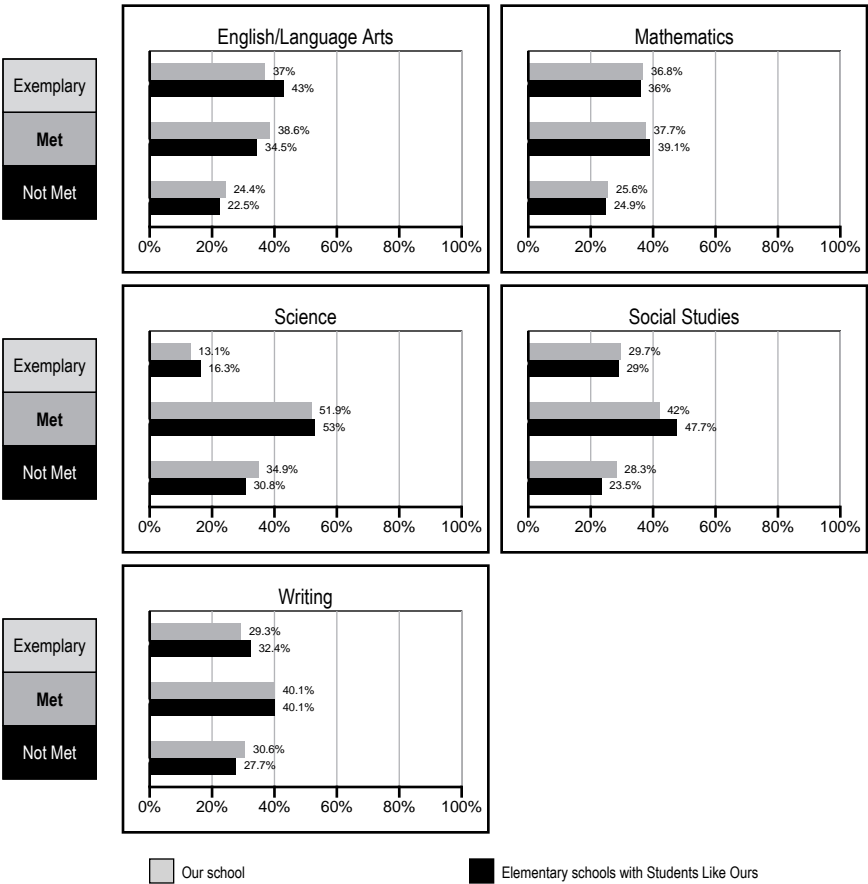

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

There have been a number of academic initiatives that we have been successful in reaching at Batesburg-Leesville Elementary. For academic performance on PASS, we received the Palmetto Silver Award. In line with the Lexington District Three Literacy Initiative, we continue to improve student achievement. 2011 PASS data showed our primary academic weakness was writing. To address this, staff development was provided in Thinking Maps and Write from the Beginning. Implementation of these programs will provide ongoing instruction for kindergarten through fifth grade students in these writing methods. Additional professional development was done in areas such as reading and understanding student data on PASS and MAP, the Common Core Curriculum standards, and effective classroom strategies. To promote academic success, students participating in the Pounce Club received instruction prior to school in the computer labs. In conjunction with B-L Middle School, we started the Panther Pals Reading Buddies program. To address the decline of reading performance the Five Book Challenge was held over the summer and three free books were distributed to students to encourage summer reading. In addition, students were able to utilize the library several times during the summer break.

In addition to academics, the school promoted health and physical fitness in children. This was accomplished with the assistance of the PTO and our community with the purchase of new playground equipment. The Farm to School grant provided students in fifth grade the opportunity to plant a vegetable garden and sample produce. The Girls on the Run program was held at our school again this year.

Students excelled in many areas. In the Lexington County Spare the Air Contest, eight of the twelve winners were from BLES. Several students also received Honorable Mention. One student was a winner in the Region II Science Fair. Several of our students scored a perfect score on the PASS test and were recognized by the state. The school featured a Math-a-thon and Literacy Bowl with several student winners. The school was also a recipient of the South Carolina Arts Commission Grant. Students participated in activities related to the Arts that met state standards. Fourth graders produced plays for our parents and community.

It has been both a successful and fun year at Batesburg-Leesville Elementary School. We continue to appreciate the support of our parents and community.
