**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

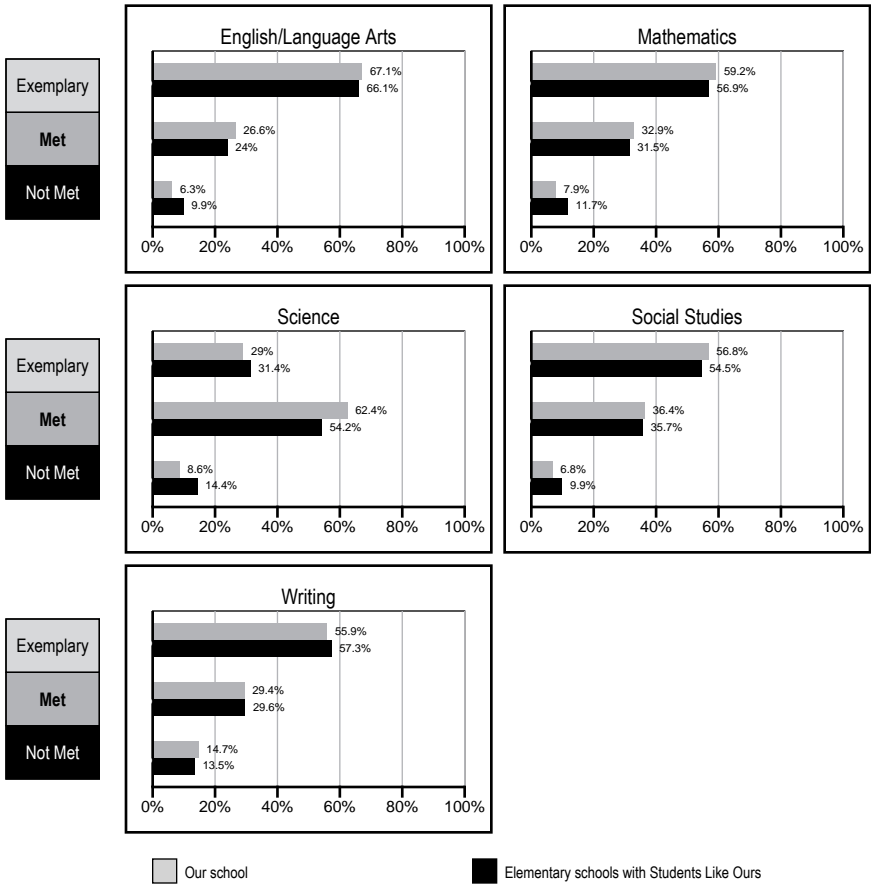

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Oak Pointe Elementary School (OPES) is a thriving school community committed to promoting excellence while ensuring academic, personal, physical, and social development for each child. The focus of our school is the improvement of reading, mathematics, writing, science, and social studies as well as quality experiences in the arts. OPES maintains high expectations for academic achievement and character education standards with an emphasis on celebrating diversity through community-building, inclusion, and mainstreaming. The population of our school continues to grow as our community is a highly desirable location for residency and educational excellence.

The 2011-2012 school year was another successful one for Oak Pointe. OPES received the Palmetto Gold Award for exemplary test scores and an Excellent overall rating from the State Department of Education. Our students demonstrated their commitment to literacy by participating in the Reading with the Gamecocks and the Columbia Blowfish Reading programs. Two of our teachers won Bright Idea grants through Mid-Carolina Electric Cooperative. OPES financially supported the American Cancer Society Relay for Life and United Way by holding numerous fundraising and awareness events throughout the school year. The service projects that were adopted by OPES were successful in developing our students' sense of community and the importance of helping others.

Our school continues to successfully implement Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) school-wide and successfully completed our SET visit. The South Carolina Department of Education recognized Oak Pointe for receiving Ribbon status for our PBIS program this year. The school's expectations encouraged all students to be a P.A.L. by showing their personal best, acceptance, and living responsibly. This school-wide initiative taught our students positive behaviors as well as developed their social skills. Celebrations of positive behaviors occurred throughout the school year with dances, P.A.L. Picnic, and Rockin' Lunch. Our PTO collaborated with our school district to support improvements to our school grounds by providing permanent sun shades on the playground. The PTO provided funds for murals to be painted in the commons area, cafeteria, The Stable (our student dining area), and theater in order to create a positive and inviting learning environment. Arts Day was highly successful again this year and was underwritten by the PTO. Artists were brought into the school to enhance the visual arts, music, drama, dance, and literacy. The Barnes and Noble Night sponsored by the PTO encouraged our reading program and provided funds for library books. An Eagle Scout built a walkway on our Kindergarten playground and enhanced our sensory garden for our students with autism.

We appreciate the support of the Board of Trustees, the District Five administration and our community. They are to be commended for their contributions to support our students and the instructional program at Oak Pointe.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
