Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

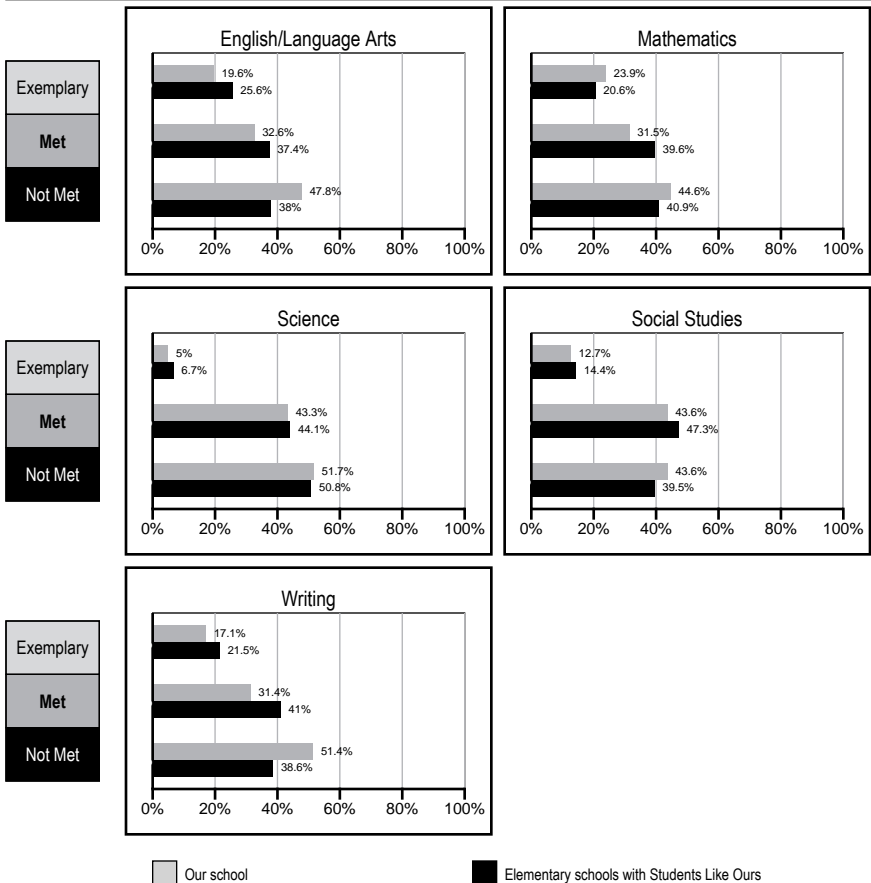

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Mellichamp Elementary School is a Title I school serving 326 students in child development through 5th grade. Mellichamp houses four self-contained district special education classes for students with developmental delays and autism. Our School Improvement Plan was updated in the spring of 2012 and includes action plans for English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and School Climate. The 2011 Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) indicates gains in 5th grade ELA; 4th and 5th grade Math; 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade Social Studies; and 5th grade Writing.

Our intervention approaches include Cambium Learning Group's Voyager program for students in 2nd through 5th grades and after school enrichment programs such as 21st Century, Positeen, Gentlemen's Club, and PASS prep sessions. In addition, several teachers used classroom performance data to identify students for intervention, and provided one on one and small group volunteer tutoring. Our faculty and staff members participated in extensive professional development to improve their teaching and learning performances.

As a 2010-2013 South Carolina Red Carpet School and PBIS exemplary school, we believe in the importance of a positive school climate. We added a college-bound culture to the environment, partnering with SC State University, Claflin University's Call Me MISTER program and other volunteers from various departments on the campus. In addition, our 4th grade students experienced a college tour of Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College. Our guidance counselor received a state award in the amount of \$5,000 to increase our college-bound initiatives.

Community involvement is a vital component to our school. We have several local business partners that offer monetary and in-kind support for our students. Healing Species, a reputable program that teaches students compassion and empathy for others, is one of our partners in character education. Our city's Community of Character program has fueled our mentor program with approximately 70 mentors to assist our students academically and socially.

We foster parental involvement through family nights and Fall and Spring Conference Days, which allow parents and teachers to plan for students' academic progress. Several of our parents and community members volunteer their time and talents to empower our students and to beautify our school.

We intend to improve our academic performance by implementing a more effective instructional focus plan with a stronger emphasis on the teaching and learning of reading and math.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
