Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

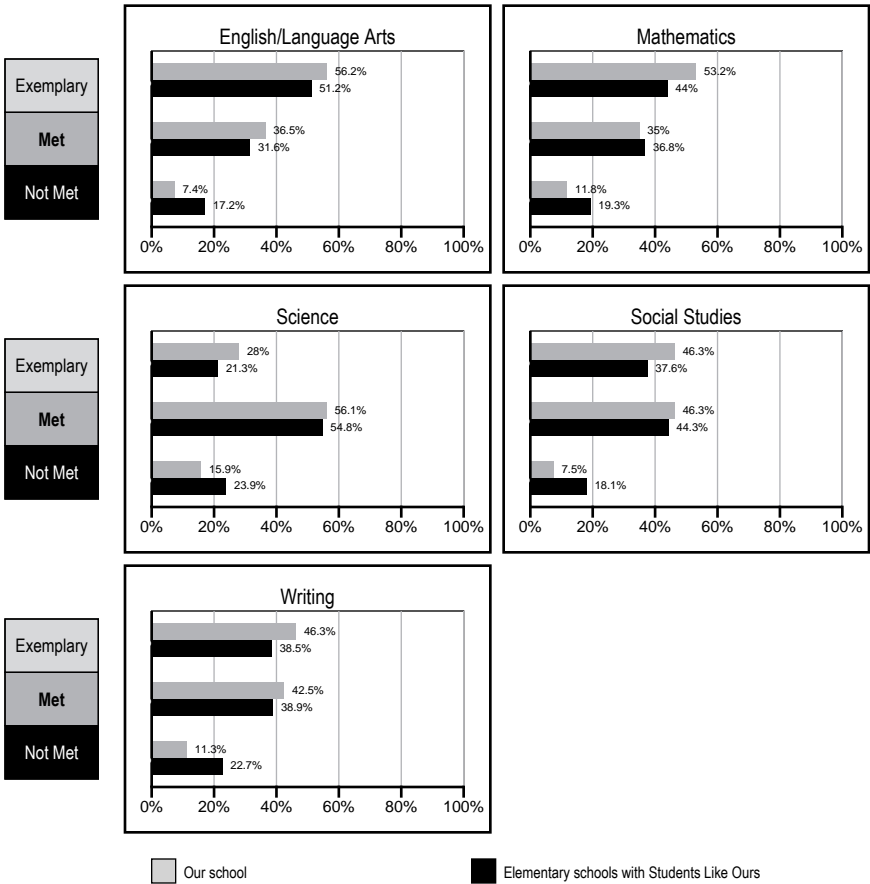

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Six Mile Elementary School, in cooperation with students, teachers, and parents, continued its mission to provide a quality education that encourages achievement for all students in a safe and caring environment. Evidence of its continued commitment to academics and student safety, Six Mile was a recipient of the Palmetto Gold Award for excellent ratings in student achievement for the second consecutive year and was recognized as an Upstate Safe Kids School for the fifth consecutive year. As a result, Six Mile Elementary remained in the upper echelon in public education. The implementation of TAP was vital in maintaining this status of excellence. A Value Added Rating of 4 on TAP's 5 point performance scale was another example of the hard work and effort that our stakeholders put forth toward the academic growth of each student. Our staff participated in weekly cluster meetings as part of a rigorous professional development model designed by TAP: The System for Teacher and Student Advancement. These weekly sessions were tailored around specific student needs based on current PASS and MAP data. Daily common planning time, monthly school-wide meetings, CCSS Training, workshops and conferences also kept teachers abreast of the latest research and best practices in various subject areas. All teachers at Six Mile Elementary are Highly Qualified and nine teachers are National Board Certified. Six Mile continued initiatives promoting literacy and mathematics, such as; a balanced literacy model with nightly reading in level texts, Marcy Cook math and AIMS math/science strategies, "Journal Boards" in math and language arts and writing across the curriculum. "Flexible groups" addressed specific areas of weakness. Single-gender instruction was expanded to include grades 2 - 5 as another way to differentiate instruction. In addition, innovative programs already in place at Six Mile Elementary include: wireless internet and Promethean Boards in each classroom; academic achievement recognition and awards; grade-level and school-wide service learning projects; character education program; SIC and PTO; family academic nights; comprehensive art, music, and physical education programs; and a challenging and interactive curriculum. Volunteers continued to play a vital role at Six Mile Elementary. Our large number of trained parents and community members allowed us to continue a tutorial program led solely by volunteers. The SIC, PTO and community members continued to support our school in a variety of ways during another very difficult year economically. These efforts have shown that the collaboration of all stakeholders is vital in fulfilling our vision to build success beyond the classroom while promoting the development of the "whole child" and meeting new and challenging academic standards.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
