**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

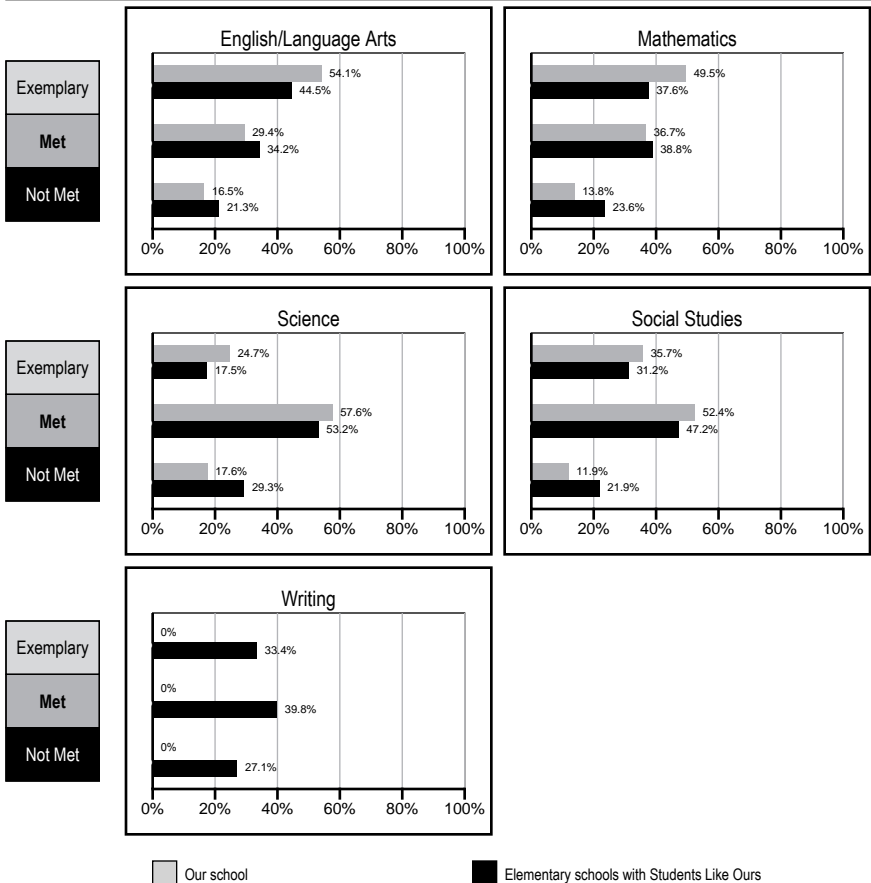

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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

Wellford Academy of Science and Technology is a community school located in western Spartanburg County. We are privileged to educate over 350 students from preschool through 4th grade. In addition to serving students in our attendance area, we also had over 50 students to attend our school through the district's school choice program. Our second year as a magnet school was filled with enthusiastic achievement, excitement for learning, and wonderful challenges that encouraged us to grow academically.

While focusing on integrating science and technology into all areas of curriculum, we also continued to keep improved student achievement in all areas as our top priority. Students were taught reading and math strategies through large and small group instruction designed to help each child reach individual goals. Students also received lessons in the Science lab each week in addition to classroom instruction. Furthermore, in our third year of implementing a German Language program, students in first through fourth grade were able to learn another language through weekly lessons in the German classroom.

In addition, our efforts were applauded as we were awarded the state's Palmetto Gold Award for academic achievement. This award is the state's most prestigious award to schools that had outstanding scores and exceptional growth on the Palmetto Achievement of State Standards (P.A.S.S.) test.

Our faculty members also participate in many worthwhile professional development activities, such as the pursuit of advanced degrees, technology training, group and faculty book studies, web seminars, and peer sharing/observations.

The programs and activities we offer, such as Response to Intervention (RTI), morning tutoring, clubs, fine arts activities, character education lessons, family nights, parent workshops, universal free breakfast, as well as numerous academic activities, help us to put that mission into action.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
