Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

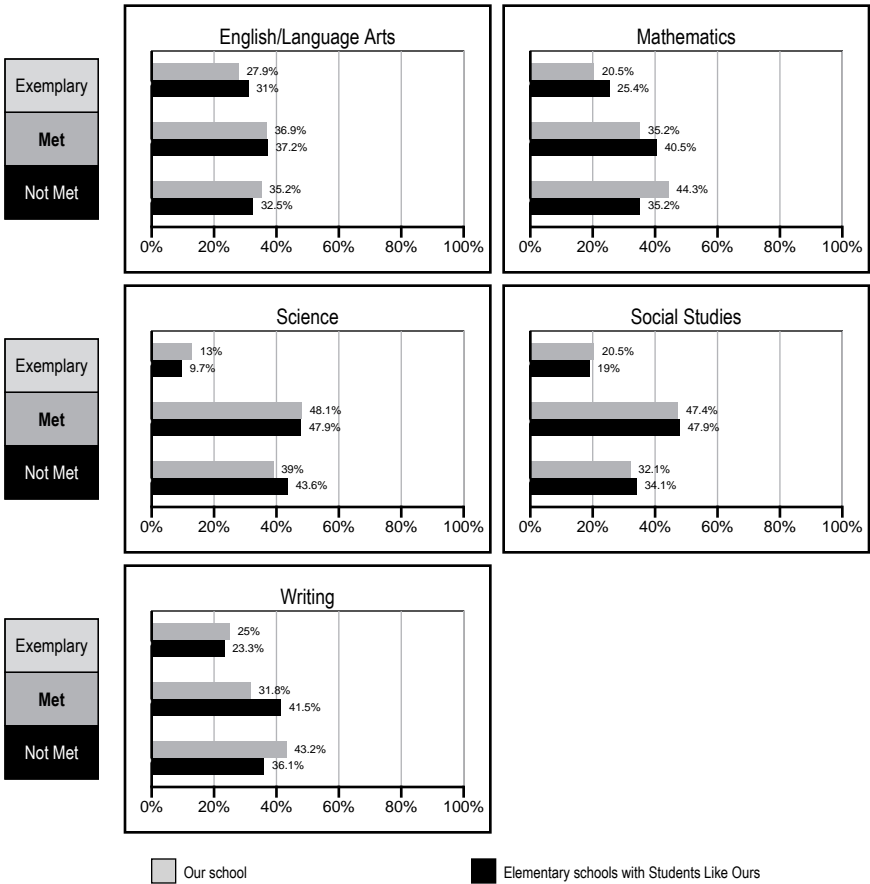

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Houston Elementary students strive to achieve excellence on a daily basis. Our well-trained, dedicated faculty works diligently to provide each student with an enriched educational experience. Six teachers have obtained National Board certification, 88% of the faculty is gifted and talented endorsed and 100% of the faculty is highly qualified. For the fifth consecutive year, Houston received an AVERAGE absolute rating on the state report card and the Palmetto Silver Certificate of Excellence. We are proud to report our advancements in technology. Seventy new computers and wireless internet access were installed this year and 95% of classrooms have interactive board technology.

Our students distinguished themselves in numerous academic and special areas. Twenty-one students participated in our gifted and talented program. Four of these students scored in the top 10% on the National Wordmaster competition. Our students were recognized in the Piedmont Interstate Fair and the Rotary Math Excellence Medallion award program. Twenty-seven students participated in the band and orchestra program. The Academy of Creative Expression and Problem-Based Learning continue to enhance teaching and learning at Houston.

To promote wellness and commitment to the total growth of the child, our students participated in Walk to School, Bike to School, The First Tee, Houston Running Club, Project Fit, Girls on the Run, and the Creative Expression Dance Company. Family and school connections are strengthened through our monthly Family First breakfast. A Farm to School grant supported teachers and students with curricula centered on nutrition and agriculture and provided funding for two school gardens.

Houston Elementary has received several honors and set an expectation of excellence during 2011-2012. We are pleased to serve your children and encourage each of you to continue to take an active role in their education and future.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
