**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

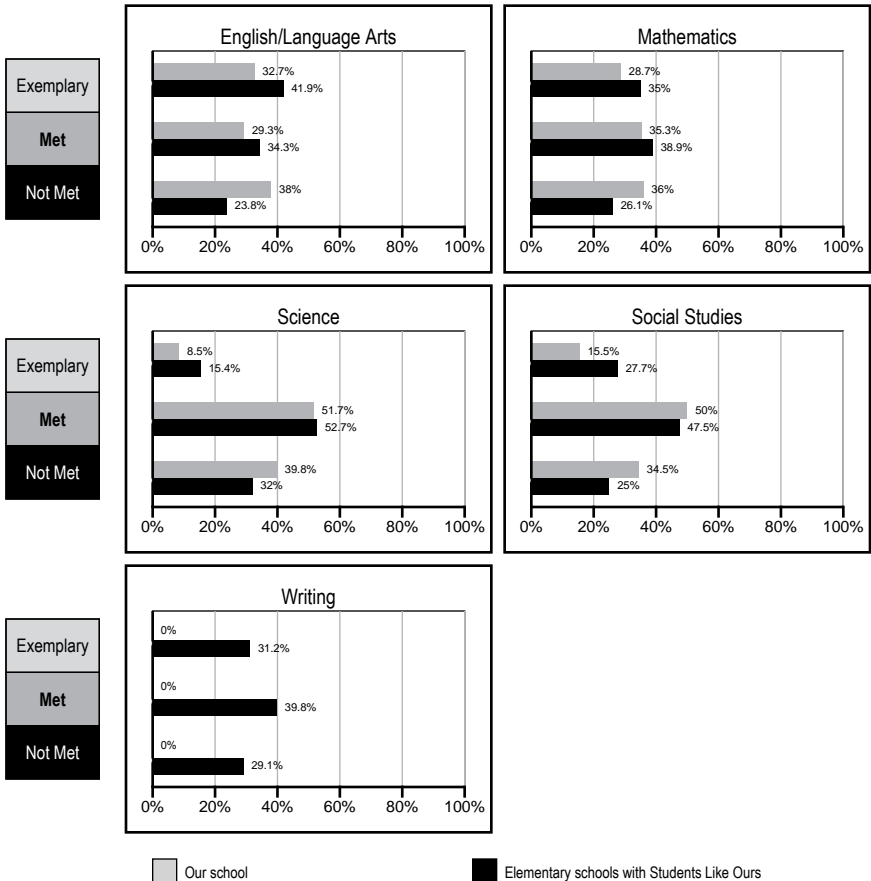

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Isn't it amazing how fast time passes? It seems like just yesterday that all of our new students, parents, and staff assembled in the auditorium on August 15, 2011, the night of our first annual "Jaguar Jubilee". Everyone was so excited to see our new school and meet his/her new teacher. It was a great beginning to what has turned out to be a very successful school year. The focus has not only been on improving student achievement but also on building new relationships, establishing traditions, and making Harold C. Johnson Elementary School a great place to learn for our boys and girls.

Our vision is to build the foundation for tomorrow by sparking potential and inspiring success in our students. A few examples of how we targeted these four areas include using MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) and DRA (Developmental Reading Assessment) to improve literacy and math skills, implementing "J.J.'s Reading Challenge" to encourage students to read an additional 20 minutes per day, providing math and reading assistance before and after school, and using the promethean board in each classroom to help students become more actively engaged in learning. We will continue to focus on these four target areas during the 2012-2013 school year.

Our parents and community members play an integral role in the success of our children. Our outstanding PTO, School Improvement Council, parent and community volunteers, and local businesses all work hard to support our students and to help them become successful. Thank you for your support of our programs and events such as Family Literacy Night, Wake Up and Read Days, Quarterly Awards Programs, the PTO Fall Fundraiser, and the Fall Frenzy School Carnival. Your generous book donations also enabled us to provide a wonderful Book Exchange program so that our children would continue to have access to new reading materials. We are so thankful for all that you do for our school.

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**ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System**

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
