

Nestled in the heart of Summerville, SC, Flowertown Elementary School is home to a thriving community of "busy bee" students, staff, and parents who work together collaboratively by expressing confidence in each other and by appreciating the diversity of skills represented by each member of the community. A bustling hive of approximately 1,050 PK-5th grade busy bees, we begin each day by reinforcing our school's belief that "Bee"ing the Best We Can Be Begins with Me!

Our high expectations for students has enabled us to meet AYP for nine consecutive years; achieve a rating of "Excellent" on the SC School Report Card in both growth and absolute achievement; receive the Palmetto Gold Award for academic achievement; and be named a PBIS Ribbon School for successful implementation of the Positive Behavior Intervention and Support Program.

Flowertown provides numerous opportunities that help develop and enrich all students both as learners and as members of their community. We provide educational support above and beyond classroom instruction through the use of technology, small group interventions, and enrichment opportunities. A strong commitment to service learning provides a vehicle for developing citizens with a strong sense of community. We are proud to boast that in addition to the many school-wide service learning initiatives during this past school year, every 4th and 5th grade student participated in at least one of the 35 additional year-long service learning projects led by staff members. With the help of business partners, a newly added outdoor learning environment has provided students with opportunities to interact with the environment and learn the importance of being "green." We also believe that artistic enrichment goes hand-in-hand with academic enrichment, and evidence of our strong arts program can be seen in student displays throughout our building. We are proud to sponsor yearly Kids Art Fairs, a variety of musical performances, and an annual theatrical performance.

As a Title I school, we face many challenges including evergrowing diversity in an increasingly transient student population. However, we are thankful for the on-going support of an amazing SIC, PTA and numerous Business Partners. It is with their continued support that we are able to provide our students with educational opportunities that not only maintain a culture of academic excellence, but also extend learning beyond the classroom to help develop well-rounded, socially responsible students.
