

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2011/2012 school year was one of continued improvement for Mauldin Elementary School. We were disappointed that we did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) again. We were very pleased with our state report card ratings of Good for an absolute rating and Average for improvement. These ratings are based on our students' academic performance and earned MES a Palmetto Gold Award for overall achievement and a Palmetto Silver Award for the performance of some traditionally underachieving groups of students. These ratings once again confirm the great work we are doing in continuing to improve student academic performance each year. During the school year our teachers continued implementation of Learning Focused best practices in classroom instruction. We continued our reading intervention program for kindergarten, first and second grade students, and expanded the program to include some third graders. We further refined a research based model for students with special needs that more effectively meets their learning needs in the classroom. We also continued our morning tutoring programs, and expanded the school wide math focus groups to address specific skills for each student. Finally, we implemented a new reading program based on students' Lexile reading range. We worked with our parent leadership and community to implement programs to address the total health and welfare needs of our students. This included the Closet for Hope that provided donated clothing for families in need. The Back Pack program was also implemented which provided students with meals on weekends and holidays. Finally, we implemented the Coordinated Approach to Child Health (CATCH) which included awareness and opportunities for increased physical activity for students. We also planned for the full implementation of the healthy school menu program called Culinary Creations for the 2012/2013 school year. All measures indicate that we are doing the right things for our students. The academic achievement of our students remains strong, and survey data collected at the state, district, and school level show improvement and overall positive perceptions about our school. Everyone associated with Mauldin Elementary School should take pride in our accomplishments. We look forward to working with the entire school community as we continue to move forward in making MES the finest school it can be.
