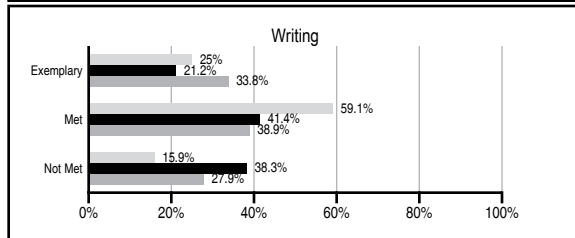

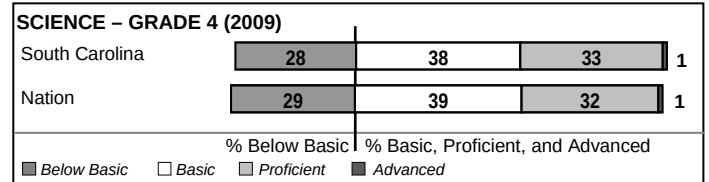
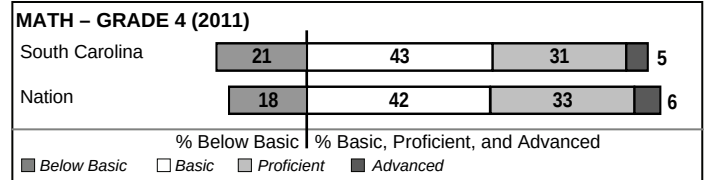
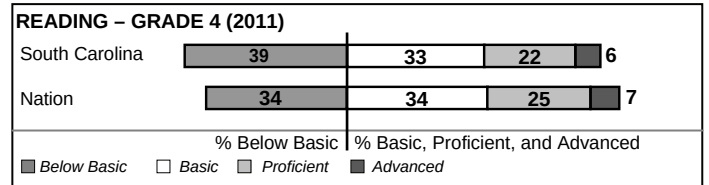
PASS PERFORMANCE
