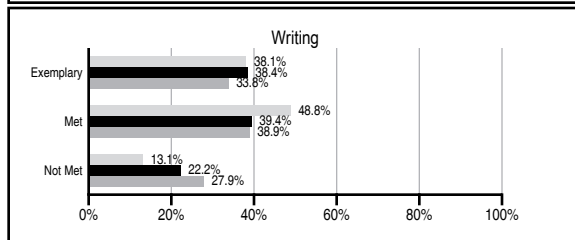

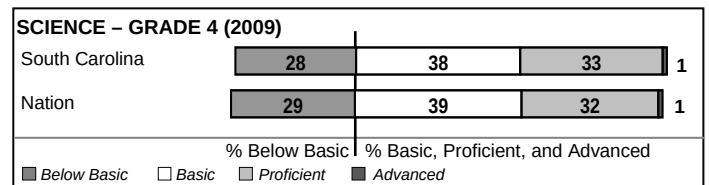
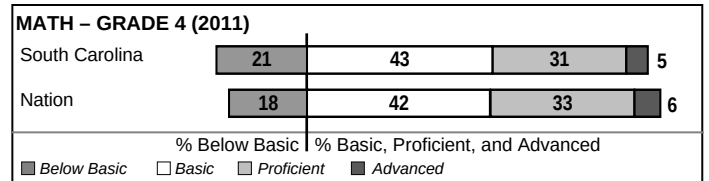
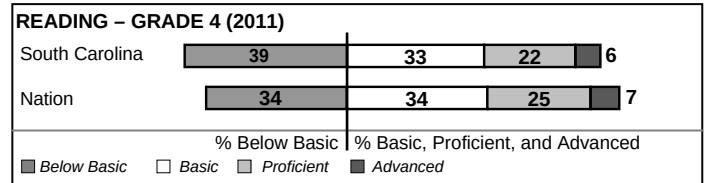
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Building on the district's belief that all students have the ability to learn when immersed in a highly engaged environment, Larne Elementary School strives for teaching excellence. Our goal is to broaden students' horizons, advance their academic achievements, and expose them to a plethora of atypical educational experiences. Students are placed in small classes with highly-qualified, certified teachers. Teachers employ a variety of methods in their classrooms such as individual and small group instruction, hands-on project-based learning, and arts-based integration. We challenge students academically and strive to provide real world applications and instill good citizenship through various clubs and organizations offered to students beyond the academic day.

This year our school was honored by the state with a Palmetto Gold Award in recognition of our students' test scores on PASS. At Larne Elementary, we believe that student success is promoted through purposeful and engaging work. Student progress is monitored through benchmark testing. Teachers design lessons with academic rigor and provide academic assistance through after-school tutoring and special programs such as Reading Recovery and LEAP (Literacy Enrichment and Acceleration Program). Opportunities to experience success beyond the classroom abound at Larne. Before and after-school programs are tremendous motivators for students. Our Arts Integration program collaborates with community and staff to make lessons motivating, active, and engaging. Service learning opportunities this year included an annual canned food drive, participation in Jump Rope for Heart, and Student Council projects. One of our goals is to build character and good work ethic in all children. Many of our efforts are spent on uniting the home, school and community in order to increase the educational value offered to our children. Educators at Larne are provided with encouragement, time, resources, and professional development.

At Larne, our motto: A community of learners, inspiring all to think, to learn, to achieve, and to care has served as the blueprint to building an educationally enriching environment where the staff has agreed to be the guiding force behind the work that we do to help students achieve success.
