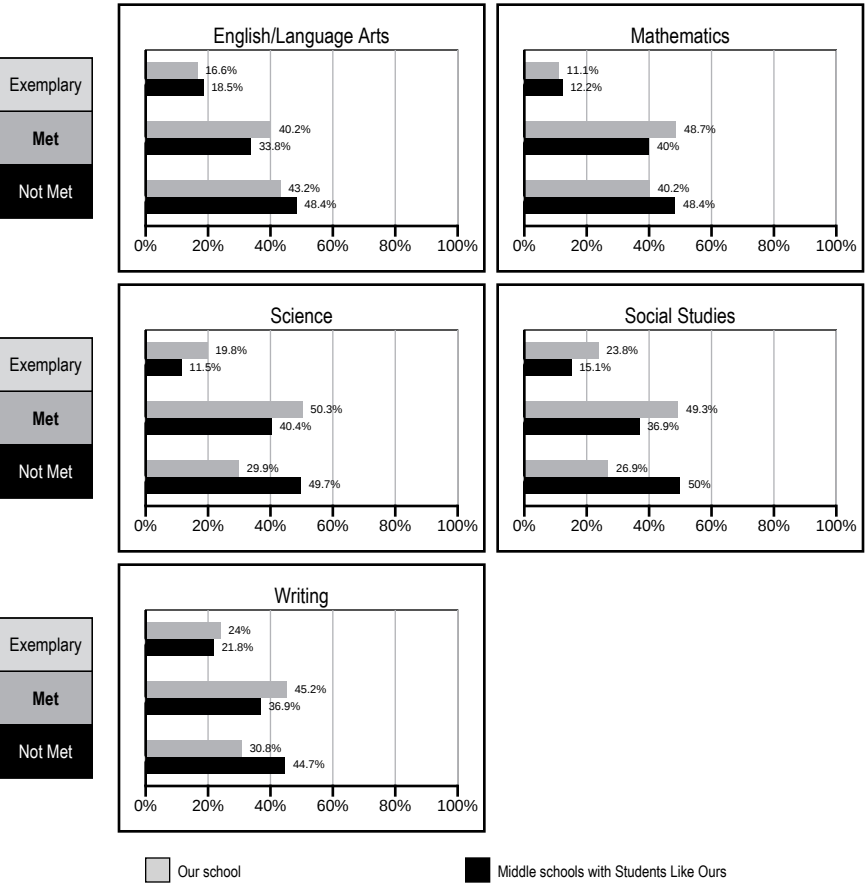

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Chestnut Oaks Middle School is on the road to excellence in student achievement, character, and climate. A visit to the home of the Falcons will reveal a beautifully maintained campus where students voluntarily wear academic attire, teachers meet to collaboratively plan lessons, administrators frequently observe classroom instruction, students are consistently engaged in learning, and teachers participate weekly on-site professional development.

Chestnut Oaks Middle School fosters a safe learning environment where the focus is on Seeking excellence, Opting to use good manners, Activating listening and learning skills, and Respecting self and others (SOAR). During this past year, our students and teachers received several awards, recognitions, and achievements. All of our Algebra I students passed the End of Course Exam with an overall class average of 90.8 %. All of our English I students passed the End of Course Exam with an overall average of 89.5 %. Twenty-seven eighth grade students earned high school credit for Algebra I and/or English I. One of our band students earned placement recognition in the Region V Junior Band. Two students were published in the annual student anthology entitled "Award Winning Young Writers of America-2012." Our teacher of the year was named a district finalist. Our students made significant academic gains on our winter to spring TE-21 benchmark assessment. Our students successfully competed in two academic challenge competitions. Our Leadership Academy successfully completed its first year.

As a school, we experienced success in many areas; however, we still see opportunity for growth. Chestnut Oaks Middle School will continue to foster and promote student academic and character excellence. We will continue to implement the Teacher Advancement Program (TAP) as the framework to provide teachers with on-going professional development, instructional strategies based on best practices and student data, and opportunities for career progression within the classroom. We will continue to engage our parents and community by conducting workshops in the community. We will continue to set academic goals and monitor our progress in attaining these goals. With the combined efforts and support of teachers, students, parents, and staff, we believe that our students will experience the best education possible and will surpass our academic expectations.

ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
