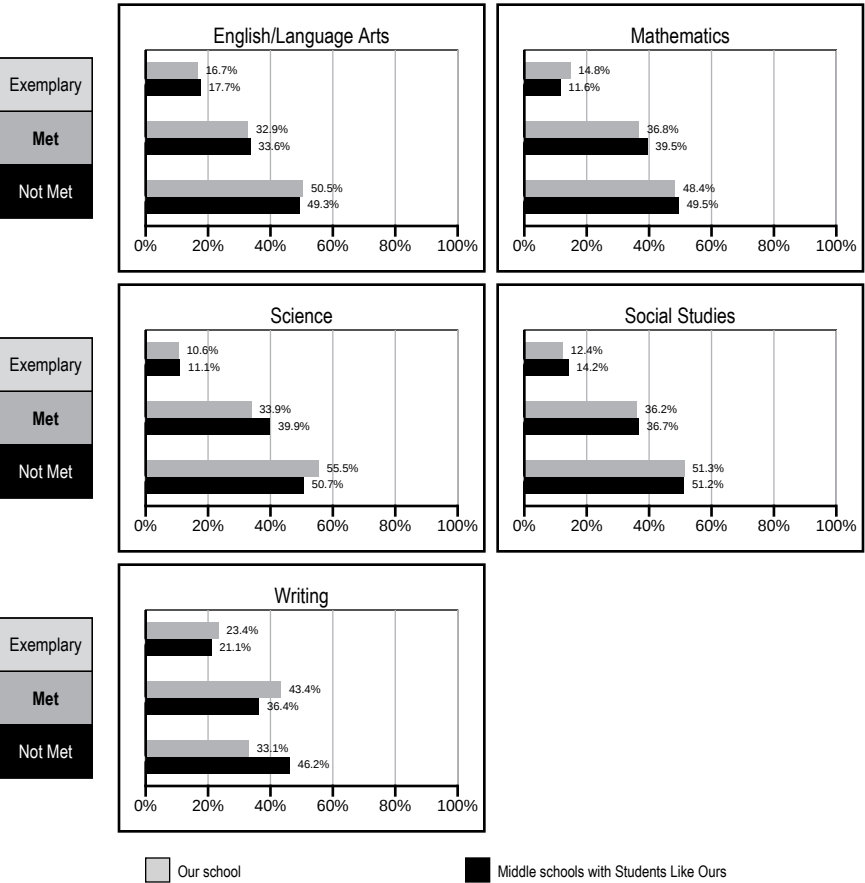

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

At Kingstree Middle School, we strive for academic excellence. Our focus is on providing each child with new challenges that will result in a rewarding school experience. We serve a community of learners providing a rigorous stimulating academic environment in which students find both challenging and supporting. Focusing on academic excellence for all students, the school implemented supplemental classes in reading and math focusing on the Direct Instruction initiative. The supplemental classes provided small group instruction for students who needed to strengthen foundational skills in either of these areas. The implementation of Direct Instruction has shown significant student growth. Professional development in this initiative was provided to the teachers. In addition, students were also afforded the opportunity to attend the after school program. Continuing the focus on academic excellence and rigor, our increased learning time in reading helped contribute to the remarkable amount of points gained in our accelerated reading program. Incentives were provided each nine weeks for students who reached their goal. An end of the year incentive included a field trip to Barnes and Noble. We also have a "Book and Key" club who met once a week. This club read, discussed, and completed projects on various novels. We also have a competitive Academic Challenge team. The Academic Challenge Team competed with other schools and had a victorious season. Kingstree Middle School offered high school courses such as Algebra 1, English 1, and keyboarding for high school credit. We had one student to earn the honor of Junior Scholar. We also have a strong fine arts program with offerings in art, band, and show choir. Two students were selected to attend the governor's school of the arts program this past year. We had an artist in residence work with students on a hall mural. We also had an artist in residence who worked with students on a performance of the musical play "The Wizard of Oz". We have an active school improvement council and offer many parenting workshops throughout the year. We are continuously involved in professional development in research-based practices to meet the needs of our teachers and students. We are in the final year of implementation of our School Improvement Grant. The grant has provided staff development on reading, student incentives, books, and technology for the school. Kingstree Middle School will continue to strive for academic success.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
