

Through the Professional Learning Communities within our school and through our Making Middle Grades Work restructuring, we have worked to increase academic rigor and student engagement in our classrooms. Collaborative planning and common benchmarking helped to create equity of instruction for all students. A continual increase in achievement evidenced academic success for the year.
