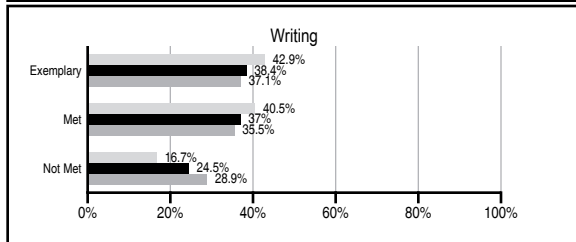

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Dacusville Middle School serves a rural community located in the northeastern corner of Pickens County. We have a dedicated faculty and staff who are committed to providing a quality education. We provide a student-centered, nurturing environment in which all students may experience success. Our students attend a state-of-the-art facility located on a 113-acre campus. The air conditioned, handicapped-accessible school has 2 computer labs, 2 mobile computer labs with new DELL laptops, 3 science labs with Science Cows(Computers on Wheels), 1 gymnasium, a 220-seat cafeteria, Media Center with 6,872 volumes, and 24 permanent classrooms, each with Promethean Boards. The campus also includes a walking trail, greenhouse, butterfly garden, fish pond, and bird sanctuary. At Dacusville Middle School we are continuing to plan strategies to improve student performance. Several strategies include: remediation classes, embedded staff development emphasizing instruction, curriculum coaching, and grade level incentive programs through the implementation of the TAP model. Dacusville Middle offers many special programs for our students including: Band, Chorus, Strings, Physical Education, Keyboarding, Agricultural Education, job shadowing, Gifted and Talented, Special Education, Alternative Education, Guidance and Counseling Services, on-site health services, educational field trips, and athletic teams, including volleyball, basketball, baseball, and cheerleading. Activities at Dacusville Middle School include: Student Council, Beta Club, FFA, Teens Influencing Peers, Career Fair, job shadowing, Character Education, teacher mentoring through the T.I.D.E.S program, school pageant, dances, concerts, Habitat Project, and many other service learning opportunities. We also offer Algebra I, English I, Keyboarding, and Computer Applications for high school credit. Our school makes efforts to involve the community in a variety of programs including: the school Habitat Project, school/business partnerships, volunteer training, fundraising activities, newsletter, Open House and \$1 Hot Dog Night, Back to School Orientation, Parent Night, Parent Orientation, Rising 6th Grade Parent Night, Walk for Education, Community Service Projects, PTO, Backpack Blessings, and School Improvement Council. Among our accomplishments in recent school years are the following: SC Palmetto Silver Award Winner; Wal-Mart Environmental Grant; Accreditation by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools; SC Junior Scholars and Duke TIP Scholars; All-Region Band and Orchestra; Student Council created an Award Winning Scrapbook; Middle School Division Student Council awarded Gold Gavel Award at state convention; Safe Kids Upstate Award Winner for school safety; First Lego League Robotics Team competed in state competition.
