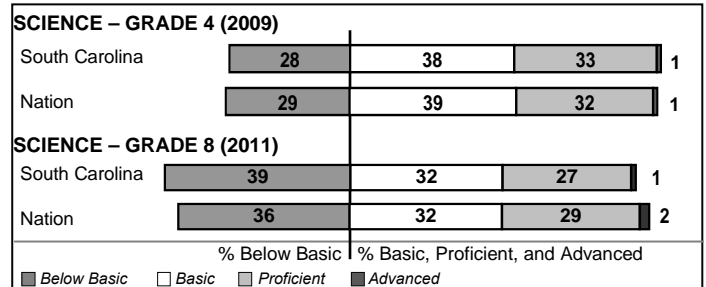
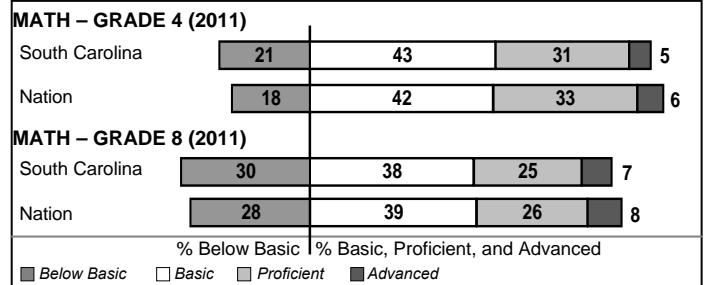
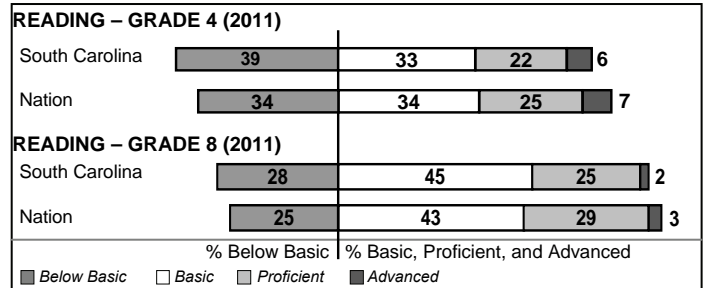

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

This has been an exciting year, with many changes, but many recognitions and achievements. As of July 1, 2012, by an act of the South Carolina State Legislature, we became an official county-wide school district, united under one administrative team and working to pursue excellence in all areas of our school system.

We chose four instructional areas upon which to focus: the creation of Professional Learning Communities, balanced literacy, data-driven decision making, and instructional shifts to support the Common Core State Standards. With these focus areas as our guidelines; we have endeavored this year to provide instructional excellence to promote academic success. Some highlights of this school year include all three high schools (Marion High, Mullins High, and Creek Bridge High) receiving magna cum laude or summa cum laude awards for gains in SAT/ACT scores, Britton's Neck Elementary receiving a national level bronze medal from the Alliance for a Healthier Generation for efforts at promoting health and nutrition, and Creek Bridge High School receiving the Palmetto Gold Award for general performance. We have had students receive scholarships, win the statewide Science Fair, receive perfect scores on sections of the PASS exam, perform in the Regional Spelling Bee, win awards at the National FBLA competition, excel in sports and perform in unparalleled fashion. We have had teachers and administrators present at conferences, win grants, and partake in professional development activities in unprecedented fashion.
