REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Rock Hill Schools continued its journey on The Rock Hill Climb to achieve the district's mission of providing all students with challenging work that authentically engages them in the learning process. As a part of this journey, the district built a plan, known as iRock, to provide learning opportunities for Challenge Based Learning that supports the Common Core State Standards and provides students with 21st Century tools. In support of this technology initiative, the Rock Hill Education Foundation held a benefit gala which secured over \$200,000 for technology. District staff and students continued to bring recognition to their schools and to the district. This included those who were selected as the Administrator of the Year by the Palmetto Reading Council of the International Reading Association; selected by the Palmetto Chapter of the International Reading Association. as its Distinguished Teacher of Reading; selected by the S.C. Council for Exceptional Children Division on Career Development and Transition as the 2013 S.C. State Outstanding Special Educator of the Year; selected for the district's "Hi-Tech" awards; recipients of the National Beta Club John W. Harris Leadership Award; recipients of the S.C. Scholastic Press Association Journalist of the Year Award; selected for the leadership award from the State of S. C. at the National Association of Federal Education Program Administrators; and received publication awards from the S. C. Chapter of the National School PR Association. College scholarships for the class of 2013 totaled \$24,976,663 and 20 middle school students were recognized as Duke TIP scholars. We had 17 schools to receive Palmetto Gold or Silver awards and our high school bands and choruses were ranked at the top in state competitions. In addition, the district's school-supply drive and the Back-the-Pack weekend food program for students in need met with great success. Our district will continue to hold dear our professional code.
