**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

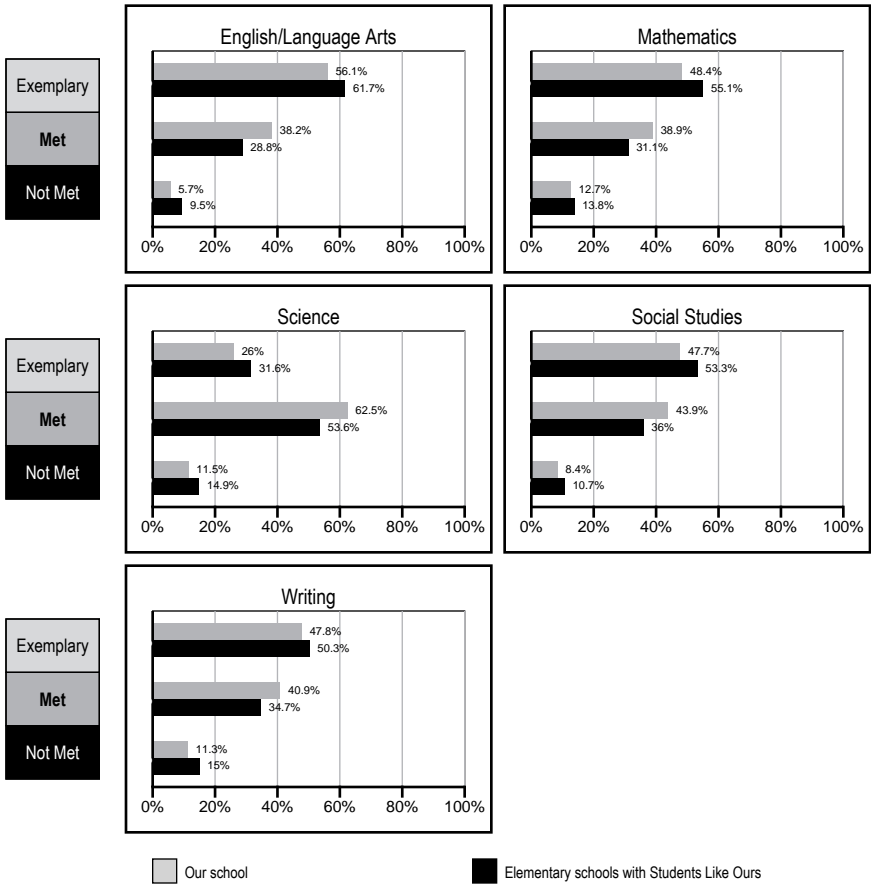

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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

Marrington Elementary (MNE) is proud to serve Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grade children on Joint Base Charleston in Goose Creek. As a public school in Berkeley County, Marrington continues to offer students many and varied opportunities to meet our high academic standards, as well as character building and physical activity. Programs offered include: Marrington Singers, "Good Morning, Marrington" news show, parenting workshops, "Virtue of the Month" character education program, Mother/Daughter Book Club, Father/Son "Guys Read" Program, CUBS Code, monthly mini career fairs, business partnerships, Jump Rope for Heart, and various PTO sponsored family activities.

Marrington Elementary has an active volunteer program and PTO membership. Our PTO sponsors grade level performances throughout the year. The PTO and School Improvement Council (SIC) meet monthly to assist and guide efforts to continuously improve support to students and the community. The instructional program at MNE is enhanced through SuccessMaker computer tutorials, small group instruction for reading and math, and a mentor program. Marrington has two computer labs and interactive touch boards in all core classrooms. Throughout the year, our media specialist provides engaging and motivating promotions to encourage the love of reading within the students. Additionally, MNE participates in Berkeley County Spelling and Multiplication Bees, All-County Chorus, local visual art exhibitions, and STEP Art programs. MNE has been recognized by the SC Education Oversight Committee for outstanding student performance results at the Gold and Silver levels on the state assessment for nine consecutive years.

The staff at MNE fosters positive home-school communication through the use of webpages, AlertNow messaging system, Weekly Wednesday Newsletters, positive postcards and phone calls, monthly school calendar of events, and the Marrington Marquee. Marrington's highly qualified staff contains one doctorate degree, eighteen Master's degrees, and ten National Board Certified teachers working with our students daily. The collaborative effort of the administration, faculty, staff, PTO, SIC, parents, and the community assures that we will challenge and empower our students to be successful in a highly competitive world. At the end of the day, MNE is a loving and caring environment for students and their families where we are "diving into learning."

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## ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
