**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

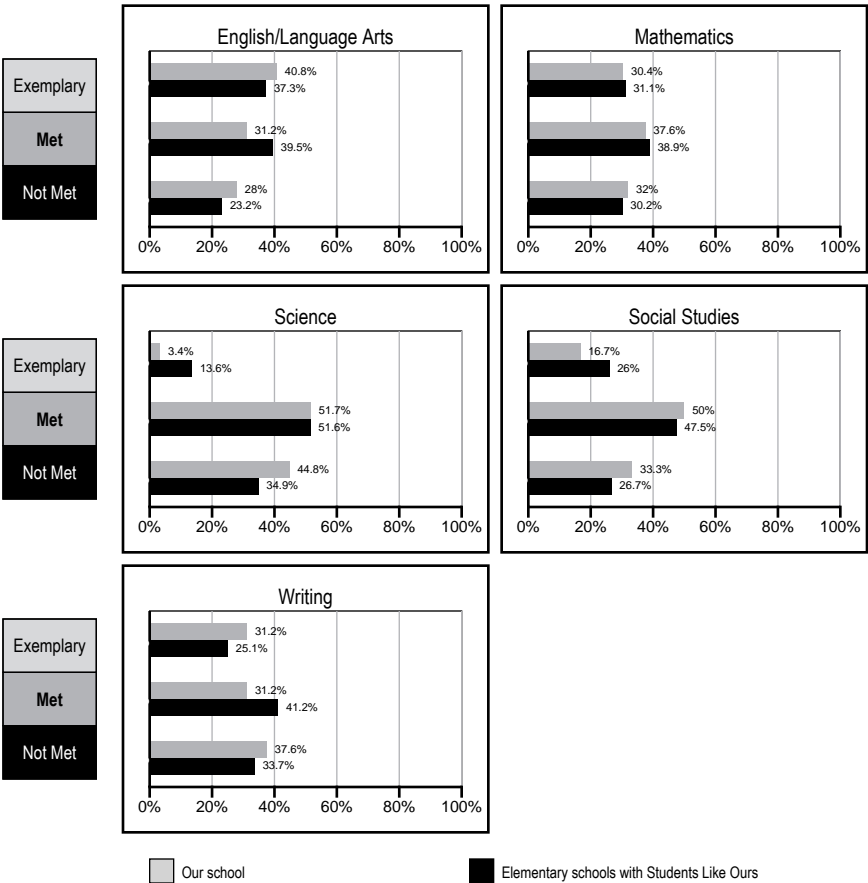

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

"Wild About Learning" continues to be the driving force behind the many accomplishments of Goucher Elementary School during the 2012-2013 school year. Improvement continues in the areas of curriculum and instruction, on-going staff development, analysis of data, technology enhancement, parent involvement and character building.

In the area of curriculum and instruction, Goucher Elementary has embraced the new common core and strived to implement the cutting edge rigorous standards. Grades 5K-2nd were fully immersed in literacy environments. Using the newly adopted reading series, Journeys, the teachers were able to bring rigor to the classroom in the areas of reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Grades three through five concentrated on comparing state and common core standards and taking the time to make the learning richer, deeper and more meaningful for the students.

Staff members spent staff development time sharpening their instructional skills, learning delivery techniques for the common core standards, bringing rigor to the classroom, and learning how to positively bring intervention strategies into the classroom.

STEM activities were addressed and implemented throughout the school. Students in grades four and five were given the opportunity to participate in the new robotics program sponsored by the Timken Corporation. A team from Goucher, the LEGOrillas, competed in the district Lego Robotics competition.

Goucher Elementary students also found themselves competing during a community competition sponsored through the Know2 Foundation. During the day's events on the field, Goucher captured third place for an exciting day's end.

Other school achievements for 2012-2013 included having the Cherokee County School District Spelling Bee Winner from our fifth grade; three of our students were Cherokee County Free Throw Winners; a first grade student was 3rd place district winner in the Writer's Gala for his grade; Carol Davis, 2nd grade teacher, was chosen Teacher of the Year; Beth Peeler, 2nd grade teacher, was selected as Distinguished Teacher of Reading ;and Tracy Davis, school custodian, was chosen as Support Staff Person of the Year for Goucher and was also selected as the district winner. Goucher received recognition by The Cherokee Chronicle as "Best School In the County", received an "A" rating from the ESEA and was recognized as a 2012 ESEA Award School.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
