Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

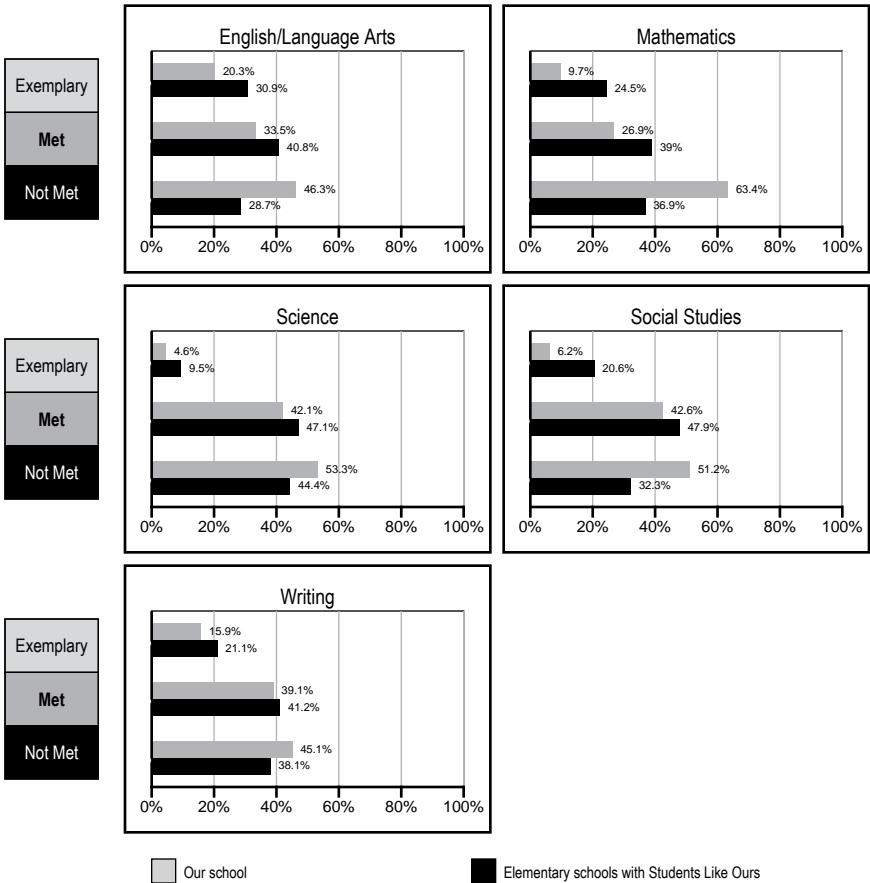

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Hardeeville Elementary School provides a comprehensive curriculum that fosters a commitment to academic excellence within a safe and caring environment. Our Hardeeville Elementary Family continues to ensure that our students are first and academic excellence remains our focus!

The citizens of Hardeeville Elementary continue to have much to be proud of as a community, school family, and professional educators. Our school collaborates with stakeholders in order to provide the optimum educational experience for our students. The bond between the community and Hardeeville Elementary School confirms its commitment to educational excellence in the lives of children. Our community donated several items to support our Positive Behavior Intervention Supports for our students. The school continued to execute its Strategic Plan. The school continued on its upward movement during the 2012-2013 school year in its commitment to meet the needs of all students through collaboration with stakeholders. Teachers addressed the varied learning styles of students by utilizing proven teaching methodologies and instructional strategies. Student achievement data is continuously analyzed within a Professional Learning Community culture, and shared with parents, students and stakeholders to ensure collaboration and support towards improvement. This year, we were pleased to share in a Partnership with the United Way of the Low Country to include volunteers that provided additional Literacy Instructional Support to our students. More specifically, a group of Sun City Volunteers continued the Annual "My Very Own Book" Project to ensure that our students received a book to continue reading.

The 2012-2013 MAP Assessment data and benchmark data have revealed that our students have shown improvements in all the content areas of ELA, MATH, SOCIAL STUDIES and SCIENCE. There is still work yet to be done in all the content areas, more specifically, the content areas of MATH and SCIENCE at all grade levels. The school's changing demographics continue to contribute to an emerging achievement gap among the diverse student population; however, our school provided additional individualized instructional support to our students in the content areas of ELA, MATH, SCIENCE and SOCIAL STUDIES. Our school continues to soar with many achievements. One of Hardeeville Elementary's Instructional Coaches was named the District Instructional Coach of the Year, our Parent Liaison was named the District Classified Staff of the Year, and two teachers received the Palmetto Electric Bright Ideas Grant as well as our Instructional Coaches. In addition, our Parent Liaison and Guidance Counselor completed planning to implement a form of Back-Pack Buddies for the 2013-2014 school year for our families of need.

Hardeeville Elementary's growth and hard work of teachers and students validates our commitment to our vision: "Failure is NOT an Option!" We will continue, in partnership with the community, to educate, inspire and empower our students to meet challenges and achieve success."

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
