Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

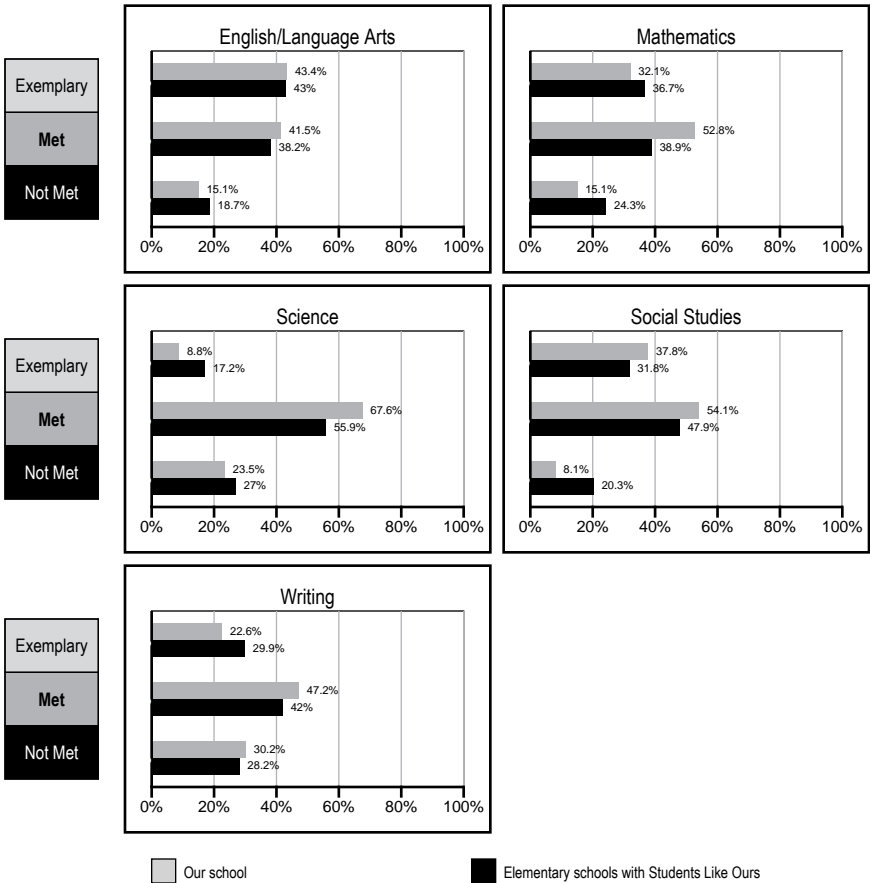

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Reuben Elementary School had another successful school year for 2012-2013. Some of the accomplishments for our school were meeting AYP 9 of the past 11 years, having all staff highly qualified and certified in the appropriate areas, and a total of 6 teachers holding National Board certification status on the faculty.

We strive to offer our students many opportunities for learning and growth by providing programs such as, Green Day celebrations to promote positive behavior, a computer lab featuring Odyssey and Study Island with a trained staff member available, an ESOL program, a gifted and talented program, The Boys and Girls Club of America afterschool program, and participation in community service programs such as Jump Rope for Heart, March of Dimes, and Relay for Life. We also offer character education through our student of the week, programs such as Pro-Kids, student of the month awards and Behavior Bucks for our students who make good choices.

One of our third grade students received recognition for Art work in the Agricultural Expo and another in the NCDA poster contest and in our Time to Read program our students read over 7,500 hours school wide. In an effort to expose our students to various opportunities outside of the school setting, we sent our fifth graders to Washington DC on their annual trip. We also provided other grade levels with trips to Charleston, the State House, local farms and medical facilities.

Our PASS scores for 2012-2013 identified Science as an area of weakness across grades 3-5. Our third and fifth graders did well on Math and ELA. Our fourth grade did well in ELA and was a few points short in Math. Writing was new to grades 3 and 4 and overall we performed well in that area. Social Studies continued to be an area of strength for our school.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
