**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

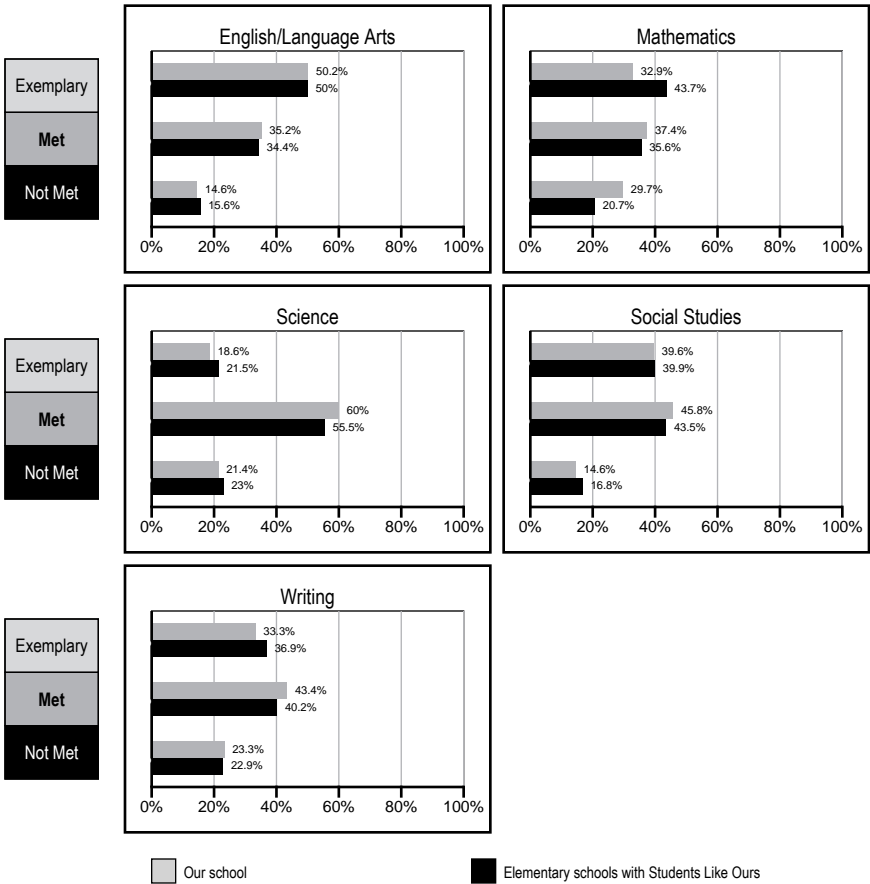

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Pickens Elementary School is a two-time Palmetto Silver Achievement Award winner and back to back Red Carpet Award winning community school that has long been a sparkling flame of Pickens County. The present building has served elementary school children for more than 40 years. We are the home of the “sparklers”, where all our learners “sparkle.” Our school has a population of 471 students served by 59 teachers and staff members. Classes range from four-year-old kindergarten to fifth grade. The majority of these students spend all of their elementary years at Pickens Elementary.

The school is home for two of the school district’s self-contained special education classrooms. We have a pre-school self-contained special needs program specially designed to serve three, four, and five-year old students and another K-5 Educable Mentally Disabled self-contained classroom. Teachers and students at all levels work closely together to enjoy learning together as a family.

Pickens Elementary has several National Board Certified teachers. At our school students participate in student council, choral festivals, school safety patrols, artist in residence week, character education program, food and charity drives, science fair, spelling bee contest, after school care activities, Good New’s self esteem program, scout programs, recycling programs, Hope Club gardening activities, community art displays, essay writing and poster contests, school wide SPARKLE discipline program, attendance and reading incentives, MAP testing incentives, and many others. All members of our school family realize and value the worth of student achievement and each other as we work together to make our school an outstanding place to learn.

Many awards and accomplishments result from work and dedication. From SACS CASI accreditation for our school to district essay contest winners to spelling bee champions to science fair award winners, Pickens Elementary is an annual recipient of many awards. Teachers, staff and parents log countless hours at our school because we are all dedicated to caring for our students and believe in what we do for children. Pickens Elementary maintains a focused vision, can-do attitude and a strong commitment to make a difference in the lives of our students. Working together we can reach high achievement levels and reach out to others at the same time, helping our children truly “sparkle” from the outside and the inside.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
