Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

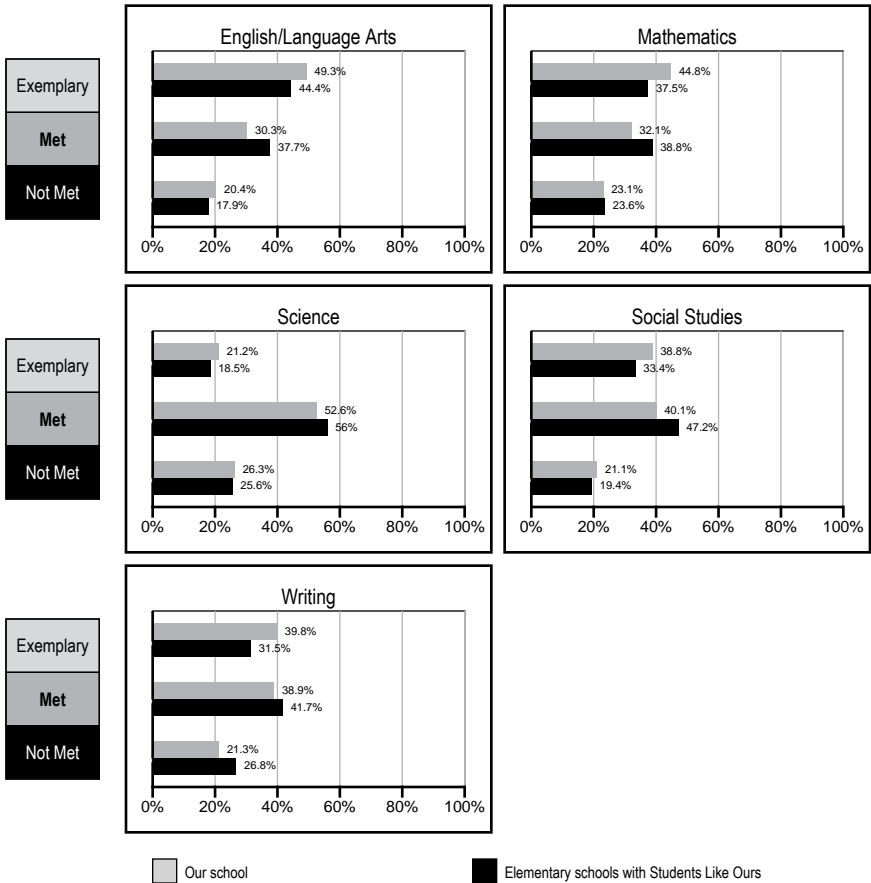

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Chesnee Elementary School strives to exemplify the “Habits of Champions”. Thinking with the “End in Mind”, our faculty, staff, and administrators focus to prepare our students with a strong foundation in academics, social development, character, and physical health. To cultivate an appreciation for the arts during 2012-13, students participated in the ninth annual drama production as well as the annual art show. We maintained a partnership with the Spartanburg County Arts Foundation to help provide numerous art/music activities for our students through the MUSE Machine Grant. The school also continued its partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of the Upstate.

As we seek to support our students’ academic development, kindergarten through fifth grade classes are involved in the research-based 100 Book Challenge Program to strengthen reading fluency and comprehension. Reading is Fundamental continues to provide our students with free books twice a year. With our balanced literacy program we are equipped to meet and exceed our students’ needs. Our technology instruction continues to expand, to prepare our students for their futures in college and the workplace.

Over the past six years, the students and teachers have worked with two instructional coaches to broaden our use of effective techniques in the classrooms and increase student achievement. Teachers and staff continue to participate in training to improve teaching strategies and prepare for Common Core implementation. Our teachers eagerly participate in workshops and share with others regarding current trends in education and technology. Teachers recognize the importance of professional growth with the goal of increasing student performance.

Six PTO programs, each beginning with student performances, were conducted this year. Participation in our three family nights, designed to help parents understand how to academically assist their children, exceeded school attendance expectations. A new grandparent help night was implemented this year to support and provide homework tips. Our guidance department conducted our second career fair for our third through fifth graders. Our parent and community relations are one contributing factor related to increased student performance. As determined by our Title I surveys, parents are excited about our educational programs. CES is recognized again as a Palmetto Silver Award recipient, a Red Carpet School and for Closing the Gap.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
