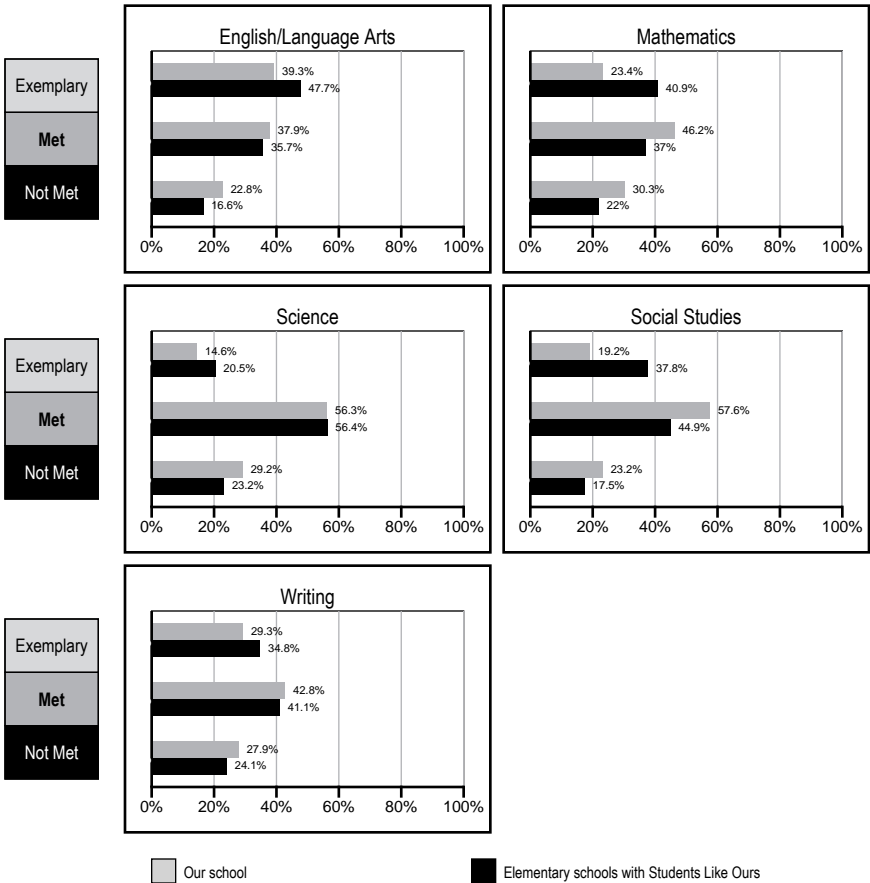

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Kingsbury Elementary School constantly strives to provide a high quality, student- centered learning environment. As a data-driven school, we use a wide variety of student assessments and performance data to meet the needs of all students. Our success is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our staff, parents, and students.

The 2012-2013 school year was another successful one at Kingsbury Elementary. A Building Data Team was established which set goals and action steps for our identified areas of weakness. We are continuing to offer professional development in best practices such as guided math, balanced literacy, and Science Foss Kit training to raise the achievement levels of our students. Kingsbury was also proud to develop early morning and after school intervention programs in the areas of ELA and Math to support the needs of struggling learners. Our School Improvement Council serves a critical need by constantly supporting the school's established goals. This year the council focused on increasing the efforts of our Mentoring Program, providing incentives for student achievement, establishing community partnerships and assisting with our tutoring program. The Kingsbury faculty places an emphasis on the importance of reading achievement for overall school success. Our teachers effectively utilize the Accelerated Reader Program and consistently reward students for their efforts. As a result, Kingsbury accumulated more than 15, 000 AR points for this school year. In addition, our faculty has been engaged in ongoing training to prepare for full implementation of the Common Core State Standards in all grade levels. This year, Kingsbury was selected as a pilot school for the Smarter Balance Test Administration to prepare students for testing expectations based on Common Core Standards. Our ongoing mentoring program coupled with our Positive Behavior Intervention System develops strong character in our students and improves the overall school climate.

Kingsbury's faculty continues to earn accolades. This past year, the number of National Board Certified Teachers on our faculty increased to thirteen. Kingsbury students learned the value of giving to others through many service learning projects. This year the students participated in the Salvation Army Food Drive, Shower Shaw with Cookies, Pennies for Patients, Camp Burnt Gin Fundraiser, Jump Rope for Heart, and SPCA Hat Day. Our Principal's Council served lunch at a local soup kitchen and delivered food supplies to the homeless. Our school stakeholders, through devotion and commitment to our students, strive to foster a unique learning environment "where knowledge is king!"

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
