REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Flat Rock Elementary School welcomed our students, staff, and community for the 2012-2013 school year to the theme of "Wild About Learning!"

Our instructional focus for the year was engaging the learners. Our math instruction was delivered with a problem solving approach. Math instruction was supplemented with daily individualized computer instruction through "Success Maker." Our balanced literacy approach to reading and writing emphasized truly engaging the learner with interesting informational text. Our writing instruction was delivered through the four -square strategy with nine week writing benchmarks. Individualized instruction was given to students through LLI small groups and academic assistance. MAP and FP benchmarks were used as assessments to tailor individualized instruction for all.

Our community outreach program focused on our families. Movie nights were sponsored by our PTO. Various community organizations such as the YMCA, Girl and Boy Scouts, Good News, Backpack Buddies, Michelin Buddies, etc. supported our school community.
