On state measures, student achievement highlights include: 2012 Palmetto Silver Award; 2012 Teacher Advancement Program Recognition for Value-Added Level 5 Achievement; 2012 ESEA Accountability score of A/99.1; 0.90 Absolute Index Growth from 2009-2012 on State Report Card; 2.82 Improvement Index Growth from 2009-2012 on State Report Card.

In six years' time Beaufort Elementary has grown from 2007 report card ratings below average in both achievement and growth to 2012 school's report card ratings good in achievement and good in growth.
