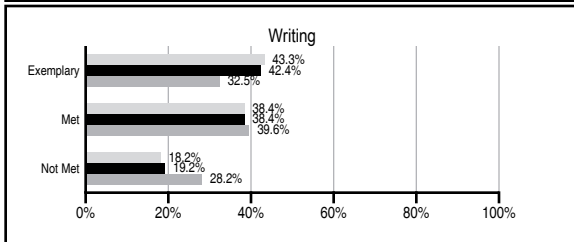

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

We are Great and Getting Greater!

Our third year was filled with excitement and opportunity. We received the Palmetto Gold Award for student achievement this year. Pritchardville Elementary completed its second year with the Advanced Mathematics Engineering and Science Academy. This year's MAP results indicated that we surpassed our results from last year in the areas of Reading and Math. The percentage of students reading on grade level or higher has increased significantly. Our "Green the Campus" campaign has progressed nicely. Our "Heart Harvest" grant has given us the opportunity to maintain our vegetable garden. We have added blueberry bushes and we expect the harvest will be plentiful. We received other grants this year which have benefited our school's student body.

Our school district joined the Grad Nation effort to increase the graduation rate of our students to 90% by the year 2020. The average rate for graduation across the nation currently is about 70%, but due to this latest initiative that was introduced by President Obama, Retired General Colin Powell, America's Promise Alliance Chair Alma Powell and Secretary of Education Arne Duncan we have a focus worthy of every American's support. Our school has made a concerted effort to do its part to reach the 90% goal. We began this year with an "I Promise" ceremony. The fifth graders (the class of 2020), their parents, community members and our staff recited affirmations to support the goal of our students graduating from high school during our Grad Nation banquet. We focused our school year on getting students college and career ready. We didn't have a career day. We had a career year. Community members and parents were called upon to speak about their career in association with the standards that the students were learning in their classrooms. We culminated this year during our Moving Up ceremony with students adding their dreams and hopes for their future in a time capsule. We will continue to track the data on our students as they march toward their high school graduation.

PBIS has continued to be a school focus this year. On a day to day basis, PVES students are expected to contribute to our school environment in a positive way. We subscribe to the contents of the Positive Behavior Intervention Support approach. We display REACH behaviors in all parts of our day and every area of the school. Our students have exemplified REACH – They show Respect to others and themselves, give their very best Effort, display a positive Attitude, Cooperate with others and show Honesty to everyone. Due to the efforts of our staff and students we have been recognized as a PBIS school by our state this year.

Next year is proving to be a promising year. As a school, we are looking forward to expanding our engineering focus to all grade levels. The AMES program will continue to offer great opportunities for rigor in the classroom. We are looking to continue to stretch all of our students academically.

A love of learning is continuing to grow and students are conforming to the image that is reflected in our school vision – "all learners will surpass expectations and compete at the highest global level." Our staff, students and families are very special and they have manufactured an environment that is appealing to new families that move to the area and visitors that come to our school. We love our school.
