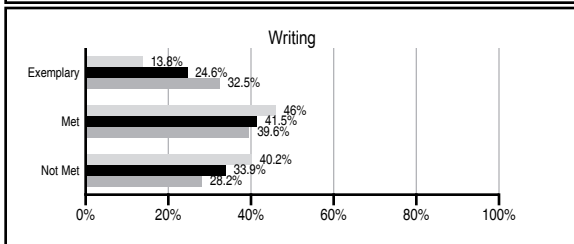

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

St. John's Elementary, a Title I school, had a productive 2012-2013 school year. The school worked collaboratively with parents and the community to promote excellence in academics, athletics, attendance, attitude and the arts. Balanced literacy instruction, Read Well literacy groups, workstations, math RIT band groups, Accelerated Reader, Waterford, Wilson, Success Maker and COMPASS Lab programs were provided to students. Morning math and reading tutorial services were provided to students. After school computer lab sessions were provided for identified third-fifth grade students. Two computer labs provided daily ELA and math sessions for targeted students in grades K-5.

Forty-eight students were invited to attend the All A Banquet. Five students earned all A's for five consecutive years. Honor Roll students were recognized quarterly. Twenty-five fifth grade students were inducted into the Junior Beta Club. Twenty-six students had perfect attendance during the 2012-2013 school year. One-hundred eleven students were invited to attend DSAP. All students participated in the annual science fair. We also held our first annual Discovery Day. Two-hundred sixteen students were inducted into the Principal's Reading Honor Roll. One second grade student read over 1,000 books throughout the school year. Forty-eight students were inducted into the Principal's Math Honor Roll.

The student body supported the community by sponsoring the annual Christmas Canned Food Drive and collecting \$2,140.00 for St. Jude's Math-a-thon. Student Council Officers assisted during quarterly Spirit Day Assemblies, the Fall Festival and Awards Day. Student Marshals and the Flag Corps Team provided students with leadership opportunities. The Annual Fall Festival, Spring Talent Show and Field Day celebrations provided opportunities for community involvement and participation.

District-led ELA, math, science and GT social studies sessions were held throughout the school year to strengthen teacher knowledge and instruction of the standards. Common Core staff development sessions were held. The school-wide PBS Model continued to acknowledge appropriate student behavior.

Veronica Jackson was selected Teacher of the Year, Sharon Simon was chosen as Assistant of the Year and Annette Denny was selected as Educator of the Year. St. John's Elementary earned a Growth Rating of Excellent and an Absolute Rating of Good for the 2011-2012 school year. St. John's Elementary also earned a Palmetto Gold Award from the State Department of Education for excellent results in overall general performance. The Association of Parents and Teachers sponsored a variety of fundraising activities. The School Improvement Council and numerous business partners worked collaboratively to improve the school. St. John's Elementary continued its tradition of excellence, serving the Darlington Community since 1818.
