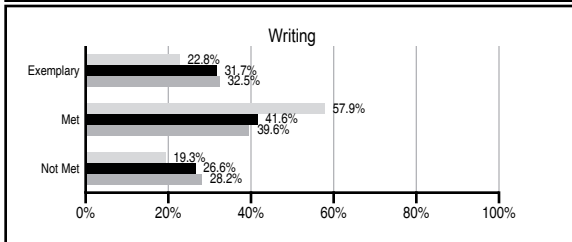

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

At Mt. Pisgah Elementary, we “Expect the Best and Accept Nothing Less” from our students and staff. The mission of Mt. Pisgah Elementary School, with its strong family and community support, is to meet the needs of each individual student by providing a positive, challenging, and safe environment that facilitates success, promotes lifelong learning, and develops responsible citizens. All of our stakeholders at Mt. Pisgah Elementary are focused on this mission.

Our 2012-2013 year had many successes for our school. In 2012 Mt. Pisgah Elementary received an “A” on the Federal Accountability Report. This means that Mt. Pisgah’s academic performance substantially exceeded the state’s expectations. Mt. Pisgah Elementary has met Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) for the last nine years. Mt. Pisgah was named a Title I Reward School of Performance in 2012. We received an Absolute Rating of Average as well a Growth Rating of Average on our SC Report Card.

The Accelerated Reading (AR) program continues to be successful with our students’ test average above 88% correct. Over 80% of our students have met their individualized AR goals. Our school library circulated over 19,000 books this school year. We continue to use SuccessMaker and A+ computer software in the computer lab to provide students with the opportunity to focus on academic areas that need improvement. Reading – Tutors A to Z is used to provide small group reading focus time to our struggling readers at each grade level.

The professional development for our staff focused on Common Core State Standards and Literacy across all grade levels. Teachers focused on using data from STAR and MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) to individualize instruction. Technology is integrated into the classroom through the use of laptops, interactive whiteboards and document cameras. Our computer lab is being fully refurbished with new desktops and headphones.

Our PTO, SIC, and community are a vital part of the success of our school. Several events such as our Fall Festival and Christmas Program were successful due to the hard work of PTO and parent volunteers. Our community volunteers were integral in helping with our AR and PBIS celebrations this year. Mt. Pisgah students participated in several community service projects such as raising money for the Kershaw County American Red Cross and Relay for Life and collecting canned food items for K.A.R.E.

As we head into the 2013-14 school year, we plan to remain focused on Literacy and individualized student instruction. We will continue to create a safe and nurturing environment for all of our students. The faculty and staff at Mt. Pisgah are dedicated to preparing our students for academic and personal success.
